ACE SUICIDE INTERVENTION Ask your buddy

- · Have the courage to ask the question, stay calm
- Ask directly: <u>Are you thinking of killing yourself</u>?

CARE FOR YOUR BUDDY

- Calmly control the situation; don't use force; be safe
- Actively listen to show understanding and produce relief
- Remove any means of self-injury

ESCORT YOUR BUDDY

- Never leave your buddy alone
- Escort to chain of command, Chaplain, behavioral health professional, or primary care provider
- Call for help

Restricted Reporting

Allows a military member, who is a victim of sexual assault to <u>confidentially</u> report and receive medical treatment and counseling without an official investigation. To receive a Restricted Report, the military member must report to the IVA, Victim Advocate, Health Care Provider, or Chaplain.

Unrestricted Reporting

Allows a military member, who is a victim of sexual assault to receive medical treatment, counseling as well as a law enforcement investigation. To receive an Unrestricted Report, the military member can report to the IVA/UVA, chain of command, or law enforcement.
