ABOUT CTVHCS:

With the integration in 1995 of the Olin E. Teague Veterans' Center, the Waco VA Medical Center, and four outpatient clinics, these entities together became the Central Texas Veterans Health Care System (CTVHCS). CTVHCS is one of the largest integrated healthcare systems in the Department of Veterans Affairs, and contains one of the newest VA hospitals, one of the largest inpatient psychiatric facilities, and one of the few Blind Rehabilitation Centers in the country. In FY2008, CTVHCS had 73,000 veterans enrolled, 872,000 outpatient visits, 8604 inpatients treated, and 10,000 OEF/OIF veterans enrolled. Academic affiliations include The University of Texas College of Pharmacy, Texas A&M Colleges of Pharmacy & Medicine, and The University of Houston, College of Pharmacy.

The Olin E. Teague hospital on the Temple campus is a full-service teaching hospital. It serves as the medical/surgical referral center for CTVHCS across a 32-county service area. The state-of-the- art Teague Center opened in 1998 and operates 177 medical/ surgical beds, 272 Nursing Home Care Unit beds, and a 24 palliative care beds. Also on the grounds of the Teague Center is a 408-bed VA Domiciliary, a 160bed State Veterans Home, and a new \$11.5 million dollar VA Research Institute. With one of the largest inpatient psychiatric facilities, located on the Waco campus, in the country, CTVHCS was officially named a Mental Health Center of Excellence in 2006. The Austin VA Outpatient Clinic is a 60,000 square foot facility serving a rapidly growing population of veterans surrounding the State Capitol. Community Based Outpatient Clinics are located in Brownwood, Palestine, Bryan/College Station, and Cedar Park.



Program Overview:

The residency provides a broad array of clinical pharmacy practice areas. Core block and longitudinal experiences are ambulatory care, internal medicine, and practice management.

Electives include hematology/oncology, psychiatry, geriatrics, critical care, infectious disease, and cardiology. Management training occurs within CTVHCS and with our onsite regional (VISN 17) pharmacy benefit management group.

Staffing is a component of general training with no additional nights or weekends required. Teaching opportunities include lectures, case conferences, and pharmacy student supervision. Residents are given a Clinical Instructor appointment at the University of Texas.
