PGY1 Pharmacy Residency

The Raymond G. Murphy VA Medical Center is a Level 1 tertiary referral center with a 24-hour Emergency Room located in Albuquerque, New Mexico, the heart of the Land of Enchantment. As a teaching institution, the medical center is affiliated with the University of New Mexico and the Central New Mexico Community College. The medical center is authorized to operate 310 beds, which include 184 acute hospital beds (including a 26 bed Spinal Cord Injury Center), and an extended care facility. Home care is provided through the Home Based Primary Care program. Community based outpatient clinics (CBOCs) operate in several locations throughout the state.

Residency Purpose

The purpose of this PGY1 Residency is to produce a highly-skilled practitioner able to provide direct patient care in both inpatient and outpatient settings. The practitioner will be competent in patient-centered pharmaceutical care for acute care and ambulatory patient populations, which includes being knowledgeable in pharmacy operational services. The resident receiving a certificate will be prepared to accept any patient care pharmacy position, especially within the Veterans Affairs Health Care System. The resident will also be prepared to serve as an adjunct faculty or pursue PGY2 training in an area of their interest.

Direct Patient Care Opportunities

Inpatient Populations

Activities in these areas include team rounds with physicians/medical residents & students, drug information, drug therapy monitoring, anticoagulation, participation in emergencies/codes and pharmacokinetic consultations.

Outpatient Populations

- Clinics staffed by pharmacists with prescribing privileges, managing dyslipidemia, hypertension, smoking cessation, diabetes, psychiatry, spinal cord injury, anticoagulation
- Multi-disciplinary HIV Clinic

Activities in these areas include physical assessment, medication therapy management and medication reviews.
