The role of the School Liaison Officer is to work in conjunction with the Child, Youth & School Services Division and the local school community to address educational issues involving military children. Through partnering with the local and military community, the School Liaison Officer, (SLO) uses a variety of resources to provide assistance with issues concerning student transition. The School Liaison Officer acts as a communication link between the installation and the surrounding school districts.

The Fort Greely SLO has available a wealth of information that can assist you in the educational transition to Fort Greely Alaska or if you are moving to another military installation. Our goal on Fort Greely is to provide the top level of educational service and assistance to make the transition to or from Interior Alaska a stress free exercise.

Early communication will provide the opportunity to assist in providing pertinent information about the local school districts and the options available to you. The Fort Greely School Liaison Officer is conveniently located in the Child Development Center Building 847. This is also the location of Parent Central Services for Fort Greely.

- [Study Strong](#) - Army affiliated students submit a one-time registration to obtain their passcode. Students can then use it to log in from home or any computer. They enter their grade level and the subject they need help in. They are then connected to the first available subject expert tutor in an online classroom. Students and tutors work together in an online classroom using controlled chat and an interactive white board. Students can send computer files, such as essays, to the tutor for review and assistance. They can also share educational websites.
