





Rack and Stack the Ranks


- Directions:

Characteristics of the Military Child


- Independent/self reliant
- Friendly/tolerant/cooperative spirit
- Adaptable/flexible
- Experiences from many different cultures
- Ability to relate to others with diverse backgrounds
- Close parent bond

Secondary Education Transition Study (SETS) Summary of Findings

- 1. Inconsistent and inefficient records transfer and interpretations
- 2. Variations in school calendars
- 3. Variations in school schedules
- 4. Lack of coherent articulation of courses credits, and reciprocity
- 5. Diminished opportunity for extracurricular sign-up/registration
- 6. Need for partnerships between military and local school community
- 7. Impact on student of multiple transitions between schools
- 8. Need for sensitivity for the military-connected family

Transitions - Implications for Schools

- Facilitate timely enrollment and student placement process
- Facilitate the qualification/eligibility for enrollment in educational programs, extracurricular academic, athletic, social activities
- Facilitate on-time graduation
- Support student transition programs (Student2Student, Transition Centers, Meeter/Greeter)
- Link school website to the installation website

- Safe, secure, and orderly schools
- Welcoming communities, teachers and students
- Transition support
- Chain of command organizational structure
- Regular communication and personal contact

- Feedback on student progress
- Responsiveness when there are concerns
- Respect for military culture
- Understanding and support when the military mission impacts family life
- Understanding that commanders have a vested interest in helping and supporting schools


