#### **USCRTF Member Roles**

- Fill management gaps by supporting reauthorization of the Coral Reef Conservation Act
- Implement and enforce regulations with a greater emphasis on protecting coral reefs from impacts
- Continue to promote partnerships focused on threat reduction
- Ensure that all USCRTF agencies require appropriate and effective mitigation and support restoration

#### Recommendations Regarding Restoration

State of coral reefs necessitate active restoration to enable coral reefs to recover in conjunction with threat abatement






#### **Recommendations Regarding Mitigation**

- 1. Establish standards among resource trustees for approval of mitigation and monitoring plans which ensure true costs of offsetting lost ecological services are incorporated into budgets.
- 2. Establish national standards for impact minimization requirements and scientifically sound survey and monitoring protocols and success criteria.
- 3. Create a suite of compensatory mitigation options which include appropriate scaling and associated costs.
- 4. Ensure cost benefit analyses used by decision makers include accurate and current ecosystem valuation for infrastructure and civil works projects.
