

National Ocean Policy - Implementation planning:

- Resiliency to Climate Change and Ocean Acidification
- Water Quality and Sustainable Practices on Land
- Regional Ecosystem Protection and Restoration



National Ocean Policy — Coastal and Marine Spatial Planning:

- Panel and Executive Lunch planned today
- Informed the proposed Federal CMSP Regional Planning Body members of interest in engaging
- Informed National Information Management System coordinator of interest in contributing



Place-based Partnerships - Guanica Bay, PR:

- Specific individual and collaborative Federal agency activities continue (primary agencies engaged: USDA, NOAA, DOI, EPA, and local PR partners)
- FY11 funds awarded to 5 projects to build local capacity and promote education and outreach



Place-based Partnerships - West Maui, HI:

- USACE and HI Cost Share agreement pending
- EPA injection well tracer study
- NOAA initiated development of watershed management plan
- NFWF partnership funds identified for hiring watershed coordinator



Place-based Partnerships - Plus One Site:

- American Samoa has proposed Nu'uili as the Pacific plus one site
- Federal agencies and American Samoa identify current and potential activities in Nu'uili
- Finalize selection of American Samoa watershed (Feb 2012)
- Initiate activities (August 2012)





Trans-jurisdictional Issues — Coral Reef Injury Working Group:

- Active since April 2011
- Membership across NOAA, DOI, EPA, USACE, DOD, Florida, Puerto Rico, CNMI, Hawaii and American Samoa
- Developed a terms of reference which includes tangible goals and objectives



Trans-jurisdictional Issues — Coral Reef Injury Working Group (continued):

- Compiled a list of relevant references, case studies, and reports
- Identified a suite of smaller sub-groups charged with compiling current state of knowledge, gaps in data and information, and providing draft recommendations for how to fill data gaps.



Opportunities for engagement:

- Coastal Zone 2011 Conference panel sessions
 - Coral Reef Ecosystems in a Changing Climate
 - Managing Coral Reef Ecosystems from Ridge to Reef
- Looking for future opportunities



Additional Steering Committee Action Items:

- Identify agency tools and resources to facilitate more effective and proactive response to emergency events in coral reef jurisdictions
- Secure funding and host agencies for summer 2012 Sunia Scholars





Steering Committee Action Items National Ocean Policy (NOP):

- - Federal members continue to engage in the NOP process as the National Ocean Council staff finalize action plans for review and comment.
 - When the NOP implementation plan is available, ensure the full USCRTF staff has access to and take the opportunity to provide public comments.
 - Work among primary Federal agencies to finalize specific coralrelated action in the Regional Ecosystem Protection and Restoration action plan.





Steering Committee Action Items

- Coastal and Marine Spatial Planning (CMSP):
 - Continue to engage as the National Ocean Council moves forward on CMSP and setting up Regional Planning Bodies
 - Consider how the USCRTF can advance the tenets of CMSP in our jurisdictions and regions
 - Examine how to best engage with RPBs to advance coral reef issues and projects in our regions.
 - Examine possibilities for CMSP projects in our jurisdictions and regions.







- Place-based Partnerships:
 - Highlight Watershed Partnership Initiative as theme at the winter USCRTF meeting
 - Explore feasibility of broad Federal agency engagement in the American Samoa plus one site and, based on this assessment, finalize site selection and begin to identify implementation activities.





- Trans-jurisdictional Issues Injury Working Group
 - Continue to advance work through the individual subgroups
 - Finalize draft action for the National Ocean Policy
 - Hold a working session in association with the Winter USCRTF meeting





- Opportunities for Engagement
 - Coordinate participation at ICRS 2012
