Natural Disaster Recovery

- NOAA and DOI have continued to work to resolve issues with FEMA; currently at an impasse.
- Assistance from DOJ: Stafford Act legal review to assist American Samoa

Roadways Impacts

- Roadways Working Group - 30 members of USCRTF agencies represented.
 - Massive amounts of existing material compiled from many sources including National Research Council.
 - Much of this information was previously unavailable to decision-makers.

Roadways Working Group

- **Product:** Created Index to Best Management Practices (BMPs) posted on CRTF Website.
- Note: BMPs are site-specific; WG could not develop generic BMPs or ones for every location; BMP information now compiled - up to those making decisions to use it.

Freely Associated States

- What is the FAS involvement w/ USCRTF?
- FAS requested a formal response from the USCRTF:
 - Conservation funding
 - Formality of USCRTF Membership (voting)
 - Greater involvement in USCRTF activities
 - Consistent treatment by all Federal Agencies
- **Action:** Legal Review; DOJ lead w/ NOAA & DOI
