Technical Troubleshooting Guide for LEAPS.TV

LEAPS.TV uses an online conferencing service called iLinc (<http://ilinc.com>) to deliver its program. In addition, the Adobe Flash player (<http://get.adobe.com/flashplayer/>) must be installed on your computer. In general, the process of viewing a LEAPS.TV program requires only a few clicks of the mouse and completion of a short online registration/verification form. To verify that your computer can access LEAPS.TV without networking or security issues, please go to the following System Test link:

More Detail

To view LEAPS.TV programs, you must be able to load the iLinc player into your computer's memory. To do this, iLinc downloads and runs an executable program: session.exe. Session.exe creates an Internet connection to iLinc and loads the rest of the player into memory and displays the program.

After completing the short Registration/Verification form and clicking the Submit button, iLinc will attempt to download and run session.exe. Depending on your computer/network/software configuration:

If asked whether you want to Run or Save the download, please choose Run.

If asked whether you want to Save or Cancel the download, please choose Save and then go to wherever your computer saves downloads and run session.exe from there.

If you are using Microsoft Internet Explorer as your browser, you may be asked whether you wish to install an iLinc plug-in (ActiveX object). Please say yes (it will make future access to LEAPS.TV programs easier). If you do not have permission to install the plug-in, click the Manual Join box and press the Enter key.
