Command Sergeant Major Ronald Flubacher assumed duties as the Command Sergeant Transatlantic District-North, Kabul, Afghanistan, 24 December 2012. In his appointed role as Senior Leader Advisor, he supports the district and its three area offices and is responsible for providing professional development, morale, quality of life and discipline of all military members and Civilians assigned. He has a vital role in assisting with integrating design, construction execution and other related engineering services across 24 northern Afghanistan provinces where the district is overseeing a multibillion dollar construction program. The Command Sergeant Major's military education includes Primary NCO Course, Advanced NCO Course, Army Master Fitness Course, Drill Sergeant School (not a graduate due to accepting a promotion to First Sergeant), First Sergeants School, the United States Army Sergeants Major Academy and the Senior Enlisted Joint Professional Development Education Course.

Awards and decorations include the Meritorious Service Medal with oak leaf cluster, Army Commendation Medal with 3 oak leaf clusters, Army Achievement Medal with 3 oak leaf clusters, Army Reserve Component Achievement Medal with one silver and one bronze oak leaf cluster, Armed Forces Reserve Medal with silver hour glass, NCO Professional Development Ribbon with numeral 4, National Defense Service Medal, the Army Service Ribbon, and the Army Reserve Components Overseas Training Ribbon.
