Pentagon Police Officers Participate in Memorial Service at U.S. Capitol

Washington, D.C. - The four Pentagon Force Protection Agency Police officers involved in the March 4 active shooter incident at the Pentagon participated today in the National Law Enforcement Officers' Memorial Service.

Officers Marvin Carraway, Jeffery Amos, Colin Richards, and Dexter Jones represented all police officers still serving law enforcement during the service by placing a flower on the memorial wreath in front of hundreds of law enforcement officers from across the country. President Barack Obama attended the ceremony and provided remarks.

The memorial service, sponsored by the Grand Lodge Fraternal Order of Police and the Grand Lodge Fraternal Order of Police Auxiliary, is the last event in a week long program known as "Police Week" with the purpose of honoring fallen police officers. This is the 29th annual police week since May 15 was designated as Peace Officers Memorial Day by John F. Kennedy in 1962.
