Bruce Morgan II of Aniak is spending his third summer at Excel camp in Anchorage, where he is learning leadership qualities, team-building principles and life skills. But it's not all business.

The 17-year-old high school senior is having a blast on his trip to the big

city because he got to rock climb for the first time and stay in a college dorm at the Alaska Pacific University

ties, such as camping and canoeing. Within the past week Morgan has already started seeing the fruits of his efforts.


"I learned not to rush myself. If you rush yourself you won't get as far as expected," said Morgan. "I got a lot of encouragement from friends
