### **Special Training:**

The Attorney will be responsible for providing legal support to the OIG on a broad range of matters affecting the OIG; assessing legal risks and developing solutions to control or minimize those risks; and reviewing a wide variety of documents, policies, statutes, and regulations, to ensure compliance. The Attorney provides legal support and furnishes legal opinions and advice on a wide variety of complex legal issues involving the legal authorities of the OIG, the Board, and the CFPB and provides legal support for Inspector General audits, criminal and civil investigations, and other reviews. The Attorney may act as a subject expert/advisor in one or more of the following areas: employment law, ethics, records management, the Freedom of Information Act, the Privacy Act, and other administrative matters. Receives general supervision and direction from one or more experienced attorneys.
