Subject: Clean Vessel Act Program Award Recommendations - Fiscal Year 2010

This memorandum seeks your approval of the 31 Clean Vessel Act (CVA) grant applications submitted for funding in fiscal year 2010 (FY 2010). Please indicate your approval on the line below.

Approximately \$12.8 million is available for CVA grants this fiscal year. We received 31 applications from 21 States requesting \$14.2 million of CVA funds for FY 2010. Wildlife and Sport Fish Restoration Program (WSFR) staff scored the applications in accordance with the criteria established in the CVA program final rule (50 CFR 85). Representatives from the U.S. Coast Guard and the Environmental Protection Agency also reviewed the applications and the funding recommendation (see attached letters). WSFR also invited a representative of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) to review the applications, however, NOAA did not respond to the invitation.

We recommend fully or partially funding every application to provide funding to each State. Applications with higher scores and ranking positions will receive a greater proportion of the funds they requested, as has been the practice in previous years when requested funds exceeded available funds.
