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1. Extended PRISM Support Hours for Year End

4. ARC SAS 70 Audit Update

KPMG, LLP recently completed its on-site fieldwork for the Statement on Auditing Standards (SAS) 70 audit of ARC's accounting and computer internal controls. Treasury's Office of Inspector General expects to issue the final report by late August. 6. ARC Assists Customers with OMB's BDR for Relocation Data

The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) recently issued Budget Data Request (BDR) 09-34 covering certain relocation cost and management data for fiscal years 2008 through 2010. ARC is able to provide our customers with the historical relocation data requested from our moveLINQ relocation system. We are also assisting our customers in formulating responses to the projected data sections of the BDR. 7. Secure Flight Data in GovTrip

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has implemented a program called Secure Flight, which requires airlines to transmit traveler identification data to the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) prior to providing a boarding pass. This program goes into effect August 15, 2009. Reservations created prior to the implementation of this program do not need updated. All reservations created after the implementation must include the traveler's full name (as shown on a State or Federal Government-issued identification document, such as a state ID card, driver's license, or passport), along with any of the following additional data, if available:

- Date of Birth
- Gender
- Redress Number (Redress Number is used to identify a traveler that has been previously cleared through the TSA.)
- Known Traveler Number
