"We do not plan to close any locks, but rather, adjust the operating hours of service with the lowest levels of commercial use, those with less than 1.000 commercial lockages per year," she said. Obama to Announce Return of 34,000 Troops from Afghanistan: President Barack Obama will announce in his State of the Union address that 34.000 U.S. troops will be home from Afghanistan within a year, two people familiar with his remarks said Tuesday. That's about half the U.S. forces currently serving there, and marks the next phase in the administration's plans to formally finish the war by the end of 2014. The U.S. is still finalizing plans for the size and scope of its military presence after the war ends. The White House has said it would be open to leaving no troops in Afghanistan, though it's likely that a small presence will remain, in keeping with the Pentagon's preferences. (More)

Panetta Discusses 2014 Defense

Budget Request: Defense Secretary Leon E. Panetta revealed that the proposed military pay raise for 2014 is one percent, and that the department is proceeding in a logical, careful way to do its part to cut the deficit and preserve military capabilities. Panetta and Gen. Martin E. Dempsey, the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, spoke at the Pentagon during a reporters roundtable about what the 2014 budget proposal would look like and what the threat of budget uncertainty, including the looming threat of sequestration, would mean to it. In a normal year, defense officials would be discussing the fiscal 2014 DoD budget request now. But this year is far from normal, and officials do not expect the budget to even go to Congress until late in March. (<u>More</u>)

Military Benefits Extended to Same-

Sex Partners: The Defense Department is not extending some housing benefits to same-sex partners of service members even though it legally could because the complex issue requires more review and has triggered concerns among military leaders, senior Pentagon officials said Monday. A new department memo detailed a number of other benefits that will be extended to same-sex partners. including identification cards that will provide access to commissaries and other services. But Pentagon officials said that while some housing payments and health care benefits can't be included because of federal law, some access to base housing is not specifically prohibited and could be offered in the future. Defense Secretary Leon Panetta is giving the military services until Oct. 1 to put the changes into effect and provide 22 benefits to same-sex



partners, but he said they should make every effort to get it done by Aug. 31. Homeland Security Secretary Janet Napolitano on Monday also directed the Coast Guard to implement the same extension of benefits as the military. (More)

<u>**Tax Season**</u>: The Rock Island Arsenal Tax Center is here to assist

you with your Federal and State returns. As in years past, the Tax Center principally uses a drop off service. Drop off and follow-up



appointments should be coordinated with Laura McSparin, (309) 782-8327. The Tax Center hours of operation are Monday – Friday, 9 a.m. – 4 p.m. If your circumstances necessitate special accommodations, we're happy to adjust our standard operations try to accommodate you but this requires prior coordination. In order to assist you with your tax returns, you will need to obtain and provide documents detailing all sources of income, as well as, those necessary to support eligible deductions and credits. You should be on the lookout for W-2s, 1099s and interest and dividend statements, which should show

up in your mailbox or your online accounts. Required documents are outlined in greater detail in the RIA Tax Client Letter. In addition to required substantiating documentation, clients will need to complete the RIA Tax Center Client Intake. If this is your first time using the RIA Tax Center, please make sure you have your social security number or your tax identification number, the social security cards for any claimed dependants, and a copy of your last year's tax return and all accompanying documents. If you are an Iowa resident and intend to file a state return, we cannot complete your return unless we have your 2011 Federal and State return into order to complete this year's tax return for you. If you intend to claim the American or Lifetime Learning education credits for yourself or a dependant, a recent change suggests you will need to provide a copy of your 2011 and 2012 1098E showing amounts paid and any scholarship funds received. These can be downloaded from most college or university websites. You will also need the name and complete mailing address for each college and university attended. The Tax Center is located in Bldg. 390, 1st floor, Suite 102, Room 102B. If you are unfamiliar with Bldg. 390, please note that it is a controlled access facility. If you do not

have access to Bldg. 390, you will need to call the Tax Center upon arrival using one of the access phones located at the east, south, and west entrances (dial extension 2-8327; alternate extensions 2-8076/ 2-6978).

If an emergency would occur while you are enjoying the outdoors we want you to be aware of the 911 system we use on the Arsenal. RIA is equipped


with an up to date "enhanced 911" system. When calls are placed from land lines the dispatchers receive immediate location of the caller's whereabouts. When children, seniors, or those overwhelmed with an emergency, call, this information is critical to dispatchers in providing a quick and appropriate response. What happens then when we call from a cell phone? Cell phones look for an open cell tower and transfer their signals to the nearest "911" or dispatch center. It is quite possible because of the Arsenals' unique position between the cities to even get Peoria, Ill. dispatch center. With that in mind, when calling 911 from a cell phone remember to give the following information: Let them know that you are on the Arsenal Island. They will transfer you immediately to an Arsenal dispatcher. 1. The phone number you are calling from; 2. Your name; 3. Your address; 4. What the emergency is. Remember to remain calm, speak clearly and remain on the line to answer all the operator's questions. We are only a phone call away, ready, willing and able to respond in a moment's notice if we know where you are. We hope you have a safe and fun spring time on our island. VA Issues New Grants to Expand Female Vets Care: Late last week, as the Defense Department's plans to put women in new combat roles received widespread media attention, the Department of Veterans Affairs quietly announced nearly three dozen new research grants to improve health care access for female veterans. The flurry of research funds could have far-reaching effects on the care those women receive. Education grants will expand residency training on topics such as gynecology, obstetrics emergencies, military sexual trauma and breast examinations. Grants will also fund purchases of genderspecific equipment and supplies at eight VA facilities, and expand female veterans online health resource options at 10 others. VA officials estimate that by 2020 female veterans will constitute 10 percent of the U.S. veteran population. (More)
