NOTICE OF COMMISSION DECISION NOT TO REVIEW THE ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE'S INITIAL DETERMINATION EXTENDING THE TARGET DATE BY APPROXIMATELY TWO MONTHS

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review the presiding administrative law judge's ("ALJ") initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 28) extending the target date by approximately two months for completion of the above-captioned investigation.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: This investigation was instituted on August 31, 2011, based on a complaint filed with the U.S. International Trade Commission on July 27, 2011, under section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. § 1337, on behalf of LG Electronics, Inc. of Korea and LG Innotek Co., Ltd. of Korea. The complaint alleged violations of section 337 in the sale for importation, importation, or sale after importation of certain light-emitting diodes and products containing same by reason of infringement of certain claims of eight patents. The notice of investigation named as respondents OSRAM GmbH of Munich, Germany; OSRAM Sylvania Inc. of Danvers, Massachusetts; and OSRAM Opto Semiconductors GmbH of Regensburg, Germany.

On October 27, 2011, the Commission issued notice of its determination not to review an ID granting a motion (a) to correct the name of OSRAM GmbH, which recently changed its name to OSRAM AG and (b) to add as respondents Hella KgaA Hueck & Co., Hella Electronics Corp., Hella Corporate Center USA, Hella, Inc., Automotive Lighting Reutlingen GmbH, Automotive Lighting LLC, Tecnologia de Iluminacion Automotriz S.A. de C.V., and OSRAM Opto Semiconductors Inc. The investigation has since been terminated as to several of the asserted patents on the basis of withdrawal of the complaint.

On September 6, 2011, the ALJ issued an ID that set the target date for completion of the investigation at seventeen months, *i.e.*, January 30, 2013. Order No. 4 at 2. On September 20, 2012, the ALJ issued an ID that extended the target date by approximately two months, to March 21, 2013, in view of, *inter alia*, the size and complexity of the investigation and his commitments in other investigations. Order No. 28, at 1.

No petitions for review of the subject ID were filed. The Commission has determined not to review the ID.

This action is taken under the authority of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and of section 210.42 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 C.F.R. § 210.42).
