



What Is SAM?

The System for Award Management (SAM) is combining nine systems the federal community and those who want to do business with the government use regularly. As a new system, SAM will streamline processes, eliminate data redundancies, and save money through consolidated operations.

How Will SAM Help Me?

SAM Creates Efficiency for Users

Contracting Officers

- One login provides access to all the information needed to make an award determination
- Streamlined and integrated processes simplify and reduce the time required to complete a procurement
- Elimination of artificial information category divisions simplifies data entry

Vendors

- One login provides access to all the tools needed to register, record representations and certifications, and view and respond to solicitations
- Streamlined processes decrease the amount of time required for typical registration

System Administrators/Extract Users

Decrease in the number of interfaces reduces maintenance challenges and costs

All Users

Integration of all data into one database increases reporting flexibility

SAM Increases Data Quality

• Consolidation of the data into one system eliminates data overlap and limits error potential

SAM Saves Money

Consolidation of the system hosting into one location means lower operations and maintenance costs

After May 2012, when users go to the CCR/FedReg, ORCA, or EPLS websites, they'll be automatically redirected to the SAM website.



✓ If you have a CCR/FedReg registration

- You'll create a new SAM User ID and Password
- Your CCR/FedReg permissions will be verified via your email account
- Your CCR registration information (Entity Information) will be waiting for you in SAM

If you have an ORCA account

- You'll create a new SAM User ID and Password
- Because the CCR/ORCA processes are being integrated, legacy ORCA users will now also have the ability to update the Entity Information. Due to this change, you will need to follow the process in SAM to request the permissions, which will then be verified by your account Administrator



If you have an EPLS account

- You'll create a new SAM User ID and Password
- Your EPLS permissions will be verified via your email account



If you just want to search publicly available information

- No login is required
- You'll enter your search query directly into the SAM home page, or visit the advanced search screen
