## 2008 U.S. Tourism Quick Facts

## Did You Know...?

» International visitors spent nearly $\$ 142$ billion on U.S. travel and tourism-related goods and services in 2008.
" This represents a 16\% increase over the record set in 2007and a 77\% increase over the post-9-11 low set in 2003.
» Travel and tourism exports accounted for $8 \%$ of all U.S. exports and $26 \%$ of U.S. services exports.
» The U.S. travel and tourism balance of trade grew more favorably in 2008, increasing 64\% to a $\$ 29.4$ billion surplus.
» 2008 marks the 20th consecutive year that U.S. travel and tourism industries have enjoyed a trade surplus.

## U.S. Travel and Tourism Exports Reach Historic Heights in 2008

Total international travel receipts (exports) reached unprecedented levels in 2008; indeed, international visitors spent a record-breaking $\$ 141.7$ billion on travel to, and tourism-related activities within, the United States-an increase of nearly $16 \%$ over the previous record set in 2007. More so, international visitor spending has increased appreciably (77\%) since the postSeptember 11th low set in 2003 ( $\$ 80.3$ billion).

Travel receipts—purchases of travel and tourism-related goods and services by international visitors traveling in the United States-totaled $\$ 110.1$ billion for the
year, an increase of $13 \%$ over 2007. These goods and services include food, lodging, recreation, gifts, entertainment, local transportation in the United States, and other items incidental to foreign travel.


Passenger fare receipts—fares received by U.S. carriers (and U.S. vessel operators) from international visitors-increased more than $23 \%$ over 2007 receipts to $\$ 31.6$ billion for the year.

Although Americans spent more abroad in 2008 than ever before ( $\$ 112.3$ billion), U.S. travel and tourism industries were still able to enjoy a $\$ 29.4$ billion trade surplus, an increase of $64 \%$ over 2007!

Travel: These accounts cover purchases of goods and services by U.S. persons traveling abroad and by foreign travelers in the United States for business or personal reasons. These goods and services include food, lodging, recreation, gifts, entertainment, local transportation in the country of travel, and other items incidental to a foreign visit. U.S. travel transactions with both Canada and Mexico include border transactions, such as day trips for shopping and sightseeing.
Passenger Fares: These accounts cover the fares received by U.S. air carriers from foreign residents for travel between the United States and foreign countries and between two foreign points, the fares received by U.S. vessel operators for travel on cruise vessels, and the fares paid by U.S. residents to foreign air carriers for travel between the United States and foreign countries and foreign vessel operators for travel on cruise vessels.
