The purpose of this letter is to notify you of the Fiscal Year 2010 appropriations for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) which includes \$73,767,660 for the State Wildlife Grant program authorized by the Department of Interior, Environment and Related Agencies Appropriations Act of 2009, Public Law 111-88.

Please consider the following quote from the Conference Committee report in your use of these funds. "The conferees recognize the need for States, Commonwealths, the District of Columbia, Tribes, and territories to update their plans to respond to climate change, but feel that this can be done within the framework of the required plan updates. Therefore, the conferees have not included language directing a portion of these funds for additional planning efforts focused on climate change. The conferees consider climate change to be an integral component of State and Tribal Wildlife Action Plan implementation and recommend that the States use the increased funding provided for on-the-ground conservation projects to adapt and mitigate the effects of climate change on wildlife populations."

The FY 2010 apportionment includes \$299,605 in unobligated (reverted) FY 2008 State Wildlife Grant Program funds and \$2,429,261 in unobligated balances from prior year grant closures. Total funds available for the States, the District of Columbia, Commonwealths, and territories in the FY 2010 apportionment are \$76,496,527 (CFDA No. 15.634).

This program provides grants for the development and implementation of State programs to benefit species of greatest conservation need and their habitat. The apportionment, shown on the enclosed table, is for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2009, and is available for obligation until September 30, 2011. After this date, the Service will reapportion any remaining unobligated and other reverted funds to all States, the District of Columbia, Commonwealths, and territories, together with any new funds appropriated for FY 2012.



The funds are distributed through apportionment formula in accordance with the Appropriations Act to States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealths of Puerto Rico, and the Northern Mariana Islands, and the territories of American Samoa, Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands. The formula for apportionment is based one-third on the land area of each State and two-thirds on the population of each State. In accordance with the Act, no States may receive less than 1 percent of the total available for apportionment, or more than 5 percent. The District of Columbia and the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico may each receive no more than one-half of 1 percent of the total, and Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, and American Samoa may each receive no more than one-fourth of 1 percent of the total.
