VAVS Partners with the American Legion for National Day of Service Event



The American Legion was given a premier spot in the tent, surrounded by other Veterans Service Organizations, giving prominence to the cause of helping Veterans during the National Day of Service.

On January 19, 2013 people from all across the country gathered here in Washington, DC to kick off the 57th Presidential Inauguration by participating in the National Day of Service Summit on the National Mall. The event, which started as a tribute to the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., featured over 100 organizations and opportunities to serve in the areas of health, education, community resilience, economic development, Veterans and military families, faith, and environment. The American Legion was chosen as the premier organization for the Veterans & Military Families booth and invited VAVS to join them.

An estimated 15,000 - 25,000 people filled the tent throughout the day and visitors to the American Legion booth were given information about the organization and had the opportunity to write a Thank You letter or create a Valentine for Veterans and military service members. In addition, VAVS Director Laura Balun and Stephanie Burns, Chief of Voluntary Service in Washington, DC were on hand to provide information about volunteer opportunities and initiate volunteer sign-ups for VAVS programs both locally and nationwide. The American Legion National Commander, James E. Koutz, also signed up to

volunteer for the VA in his home state of Indiana. More than 70 applicants took the first step toward becoming part of the VAVS family!





Northern Indiana Veterans are Lovin' this Generous Donation

What began as a simple project for Randy Davis, leader of the Veteran's Gift Card Project, quickly grew into a campaign reaching as many Veterans as possible. For the second year Mr. Davis

delivered 2,450 five-dollar McDonald's Gift Cards to hospitalized Veterans and outpatients at the Marion VA facility.

When Mr. Davis met and visited with the Voluntary Service Specialist at the medical center and was given a donation "needs list" he noticed one of the items listed were gift cards to fast food restaurants. He started with a goal to raise money to buy 150 five-dollar McDonald's gift cards. Last year he had received monies and/or cards which surpassed his goal and donated 2000 McDonald's gift cards. This year, Mr. Davis continued with his project, which is now called the Veterans Gift Card Project. He has delivered 2,450 cards to the Marion facility with scheduled visits to VANIHCS Community Based Outpatient Clinics and the Fort Wayne facility. He will distribute additional cards as the Veterans Gift Card Project has funded over 9,000 cards to be distributed to local Indiana VA facilities.



We are grateful and appreciative of Mr. Davis and the Veterans Gift Card Project. Through his donation, Voluntary Services has provided "McDonald's Day" to our inpatient Veterans, recreational outings to a McDonald's restaurant, meals to homeless Veterans, and special McDonald's flurries and smoothies to the Veterans of our Palliative Care unit. The gift cards will also be distributed to Veterans during upcoming special recognition days i.e. National Salute Week, Armed Forces Day, and Military birthdays, etc. The Veterans and families have expressed their gratitude and enjoyment of the special treats from Mr. Davis and the gift card project. It's a pure delight to witness the smiles brought to our Veterans by thoughtfulness of our donors and volunteers.
