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Major Muslim-Organized Cultural Festival Expands in Chicago

Takin' It to the Streets addresses social issues by featuring the arts

Washington — Thousands of people descended on Chicago's Marquette Park June 19 to attend the Takin' It to the Streets Urban International Festival. Organized by the Inner-City Muslim Action Network (IMAN), this year's festival attracted Muslims and non-Muslims from every corner of America.

Hip-hop artist Mos Def headlined a list of local and international musicians who entertained crowds of up to 40,000. First held in 1997 and celebrated biannually, the Takin' It to the Streets festival continues to grow in size and scope.

Organizers said they needed an extra year to plan this festival, the largest in its history. Ahlam Said, IMAN's communications manager, said the event included musicians from other countries for the first time, which led to the expansion of the festival from a weekend to nearly a week.

"Because the Muslim community here in Chicago is so diverse, we are always forced to take into account the international issues around us in our community from different parts of the world, so we are always trying to draw connections between what is going on locally to what is going on globally," Said said. <u>Read more...</u>

Flag Day: The Birthday of the Stars and Stripes

يوم العَلَم: ذكرى ولادة راية النجوم والخطوط

Washington — June 14 is Flag Day in the United States. It is the anniversary of the adoption of the Stars and Stripes as America's official flag in 1777 by the Continental Congress. The first flag consisted of 13 stars on a field of blue and 13 alternating red and white stripes, representing the original Colonies. As states were added, the flag was modified to reflect their addition to the nation. The 13 stripes remain, but today there is a star for each of the 50 states.

Every year, the president proclaims June 14 as Flag Day and orders flags displayed on all federal buildings; many Americans fly the flag in front of homes and businesses. The week that includes June 14 is National Flag Week.


واشنطن – يحتفل في 14 حزيران/يونيو من كل عام بيوم العلم في الولايات المتحدة. ويصادف هذا اليوم الذكرى السنوية لتبني المؤتمر القاري الراية المكونة من النجوم والخطوط في العام 1777 واعتمادها علما رسميا لأميركا. وقد تألف أول علم أميركي من 13 نجمة على مسطح يتألف بدوره من 13 عشر خطا متتاليا أفقيا من اللونين الأحمر والأبيض تمثل المستعمرات الأصلية. وكلما زاد عدد الولايات التي انضمت إلى الاتحاد جرى تعديل العلم بشكل يعبر عن الإضافة الجديدة إلى الدولة. وفي حين ظل عدد الخطوط الحمراء والبيضاء الثلاثة عشر ثابتا فإن عدد الزجوم أصبح اليوم 50 تمثل كل منها ولاية من الولايات التمسين.

ويصدر الرئيس في كل سنة بيانا يعلن فيه 14 حزيران/يونيو يوم العلم ويأمر برفع الأعلام على كل المباني الفدرالية، ويرفع الكثيرون من الأميركيين الأعلام أمام بيوتهم وعلى منشآت ومقار أعمالهم. ويعتبر الأسبوع الذي يقع فيه 14 حزيران/يونيو أسبوع العلم القومي.

What is MEPI?

The <u>Middle East Partnership Initiative (MEPI)</u>, located within the Bureau of Near Eastern Affairs at the U.S. Department of State, supports efforts to expand political participation, strengthen civil society and the rule of law, empower women and youth, create educational opportunities, and foster economic reform throughout the Middle East and North Africa (MENA). Through timely, responsive and innovative approaches, MEPI projects provide critical assistance to local reformers using three primary programming mechanisms:

- Education and Exchange Programs
- MEPI Local Grants
- Washington Awards

In addition to its main office in Washington, DC, MEPI maintains two regional offices in Tunis and Abu Dhabi. The <u>MEPI Regional Office (RO) in Tunis</u> administers more than \$2 million in programming each year across North Africa and the Levant, including the Palestinian Territories. Programs consist of conferences, exchange programs, and funding opportunities such as the Local Grants Program and Civil Society Grants.

MEPI Coordinators are located in U.S. Embassies and Consulates across the region. The MEPI Coordinator in the U.S. Consulate General Jerusalem provides oversight of all MEPI programming in the Palestinian Territories and serves as the local point of contact for MEPI award recipients. The U.S. Consulate General in pleased Jerusalem is to announce the Academic Year competition 2011 for the Fulbright Foreign Language Teaching Assistant (FLTA) program. The Fulbright FLTA program is an integral part of the Fulbright student program. The nine month, non-degree program will host around 125 Arabic FLTAs from Algeria, Bahrain, Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon, Kuwait. Libya, Morocco, Oman, the Palestinian Territories, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Syria, Tunisia, the United Arab Emirates, and Yemen.

The FLTA program, funded by the State Department Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs (ECA), is aimed at strengthening foreign language instruction at U.S. colleges and universities, and some high schools, while providing future foreign teachers of English with the opportunity to refine their skills, increase their English language proficiency and extend their knowledge of U.S. society and culture.
