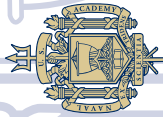

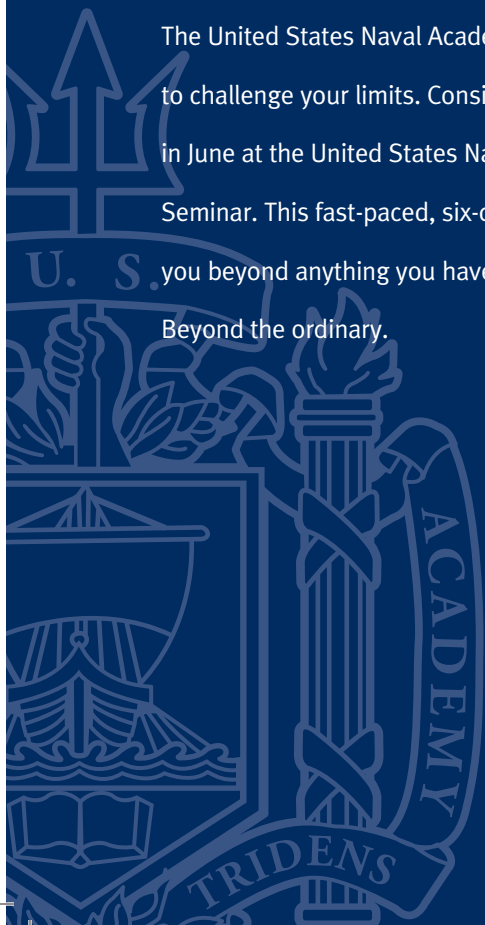

# STUDENT SELECTION

Interested students should visit the USNA website for application dates and availability. In early January of their junior year, students may begin applications. Selection is based in large part on ensuring geographic representation along with overall accomplishments in and out of the classroom. All applicants will be notified of their status by April 15.

Due to the limited space available in each session, many interested young men and women are not selected to participate in Summer Seminar. Students who are not selected for the summer program are strongly encouraged to continue the USNA application process.

# PROGRAM TUITION & TRAVEL EXPENSES

The tuition to attend a session is \$350, which pays for your room and board, as well as a variety of materials. **Some scholarships are available based on financial need.** Plan on bringing extra cash for snacks and souvenirs.

Each student is responsible for arranging transportation to and from the Naval Academy. Those flying commercial air should make arrangements to arrive at Baltimore-Washington International airport (BWI) between 9am and 3:30pm on Day 1 of the seminar. Departure flights should be scheduled to depart BWI no earlier than 3:00pm on the last day of the seminar. Buses and midshipman escorts will be on hand to get you to and from the Academy and BWI.

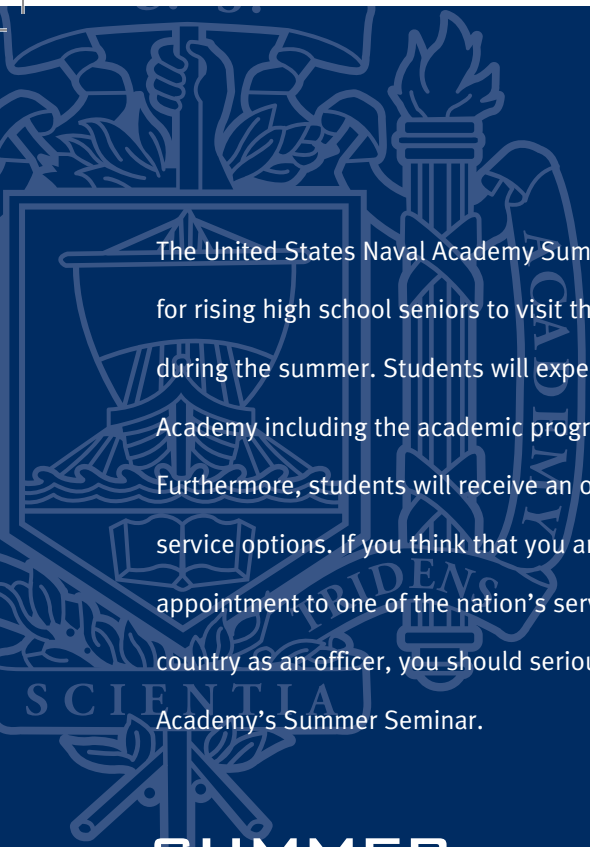

The Naval Academy Summer Seminar Program is offered exclusively to young men and women who have just completed their junior year of high school. The following general selection criteria are considered:

- *United States citizen*
- *Unmarried, not pregnant and have no legal obligation to support a child, children, or other individual(s)*
- *Academic performance (grades, class rank, etc.)*
- *Demonstrated achievement in athletics and extracurricular activities, especially demonstrating leadership potential in these areas*
- *Physically fit and in good health*
- *Positive attitude, be self-disciplined, and be of good moral character*
