ORDER AND SUPPORTING MEMORANDUM

A document including three complaints of judicial misconduct was received by the court on October 8, 2009. The complaints concern three judges of this court.

In complainant's case before the United States Court of Federal Claims, that court dismissed the complaint for lack of subject matter jurisdiction and failure to state a claim upon which relief could be granted. The complainant appealed to this court. A panel of three judges affirmed the judgment of the Court of Federal Claims. The complaints are against the panel members.

The complainant asserts, inter alia, that the judges "did not read any of the medical documentation sent to the courts" and states that his "injury claim received no fair adjudication."

A complaint must be dismissed if the complaint is directed to the merits of a decision or procedural rulings. Rule 11(c)(1)(B) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings. The complaints against the three judges of this court are entirely directed to the merits of the decision and rulings and thus must be dismissed.

Accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

The complaints are dismissed pursuant to Rule 11(c)(1)(B) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings.
