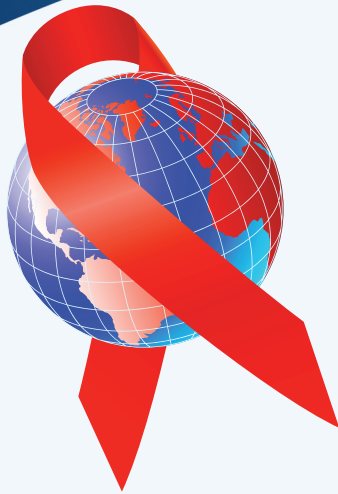

## AIDSinfo Resources

### Guidelines

AIDSinfo provides the most up-to-date, federally approved medical practice guidelines on management of HIV/AIDS and related conditions in both Web-friendly and printer-friendly formats. Users can find specific information by using advanced search features. AIDSinfo also offers plain language educational materials, in both English and Spanish, to help consumers understand the clinical guidelines.

### Clinical Trials Search

AIDSinfo offers quick search capabilities that help users sort through more than 3,800 HIV/AIDS-related clinical trials available from *ClinicalTrials.gov*. Create a customizable search or use one of the more than 80 preconfigured searches. AIDSinfo also enables users to specifically search for HIV/AIDS vaccine trials.

### Drug Database

The AIDSinfo drug database is a reliable and comprehensive source of information on HIV-related medications. It includes drugs used to treat HIV and opportunistic infections as well as drugs used to counter side effects of anti-HIV medications. The AIDSinfo drug database provides drug information tailored to multiple audiences: health professionals and English- and Spanish-speaking patients.
