You can check these on line (free of charge) and add additional funds (for a fee). Using this web site will also remind you when your account is low (under \$10.00). You can access this web site at: www.mealpayplus.com; <http://www.mealpayplus.com/>. When you log in you will be given instructions on how to set up an account.

1. You will need your child's ID number from the Horizon System. This number you must get from the school cafeteria or PX. This is not the 4 digit PIN. It is a separate ID number.
2. You will be asked for your address and state. The state you must choose is Armed Forces Europe AE. At the second place for your stated, select Exchange.
3. You will be asked for a school district. The school district is AAFES-Grafenwoehr.
4. There is a fee to make payments. Everything else is free.
5. Hopefully this will help prevent some of the charges for your child as you can be reminded automatically by email if the account is low.

If you are new to the area you will need to open a Horizon account at the school cafeteria or the PX. I recommend that you do everything with your AAFES account at the school between the hours of 0800-1000. School attendance is important and in order to receive the best education, students need to Be Here! DoDEA's system-wide attendance policy for students is consistent with those found in many public schools throughout the United States.

School attendance issues have been identified as a serious issue for children throughout the country and military children are no exception.

DoDEA's attendance policy provides specific guidance on attendance, absences and identifies support services for students at-risk for not fulfilling the grade or course requirements.

It's not surprising that regular school attendance correlates directly with success in academic work, improves social interaction with adults and peers and provides opportunities for important communication between teachers and students. Regular attendance also has a cumulative effect of establishing life-long positive traits — responsibility, determination, respect for rules of society -- that are critical for developing career readiness skills, success in college and in life.

Here are a few of the highlights of the policy:

- All students are required to attend school for 180 instructional days per school year.
- Academic penalties will not be imposed for excused absences.
- Whenever a student needs to be out for more than five days, the teacher will provide a Student Educational Monitoring Plan to lessen the impact of a student missing instruction in class.
- Excused absences can include:
 - Personal illness
 - Medical, dental, or mental health appointment
 - Serious illness in the student's immediate family
 - A death in the student's immediate family or of a relative
 - Religious holiday
 - Emergency conditions such as fire, flood, or storm
 - Unique family circumstances warranting absence and coordinated with school administration.
 - College visits that cannot be scheduled on non-school days

- Reasonable amounts of time surrounding deployments and reintegration providing missed schoolwork is obtained in advance and completed upon return.

The policy establishes a balance between the need for military families to spend time together following deployment, while emphasizing the importance of education. We have and will continue to be as flexible as possible in accommodating the precious time families have together but flexibilities and accommodations have limitations, especially when they impact on student performance and attendance at school.

Procedures for monitoring daily student attendance and communicating with families are established in this policy. Academic penalties will not be imposed for excused absences. Students at-risk will be monitored by the Student Support Team and school administration to include the identification of supports and interventions.

Many families—both military and non-military—underestimate the importance of regular school attendance for young children (kindergarten and first grade) but even missing just 5% of kindergarten—that's just nine days—can be an indicator that a child will fall behind by the fifth grade.

Children take their cue from their parents when it comes to the importance of school attendance. To have a quality education experience, you need to be here.

There are times when a student needs to miss school - everyone understands that. But attendance is important. To have a quality education experience, you need to Be Here.

Attendance—what parents should know

- Parents can team up with teachers to make sure students are in school and ready to learn.
- How parents can help:
 - Schedule medical and dental appointments outside of school hours.
 - Schedule vacations during school breaks.
 - Schedule Permanent Change of Station (PCS) moves to coincide with summer breaks or other scheduled school breaks.
 - When moving, check school calendars to be aware of important school dates (beginning/ending of school year; testing dates, breaks, etc.).
 - Make it a habit to contact their child's teachers/principals to arrange to pick up missed school work, either in advance if the absence is known, or the same day their child is absent.



The School Advisory Committee (SAC) is composed of an equal number of locally elected parents and full-time professional school employees. The SAC advises its school principal on all local school-related matters, including educational programs, resources, services, and policies. Representatives are required to serve for two school years.

MEMORANDUM FOR PARENTS AND STAFF

SUBJECT: Notification of AHERA Inspection

As required by the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) of 1986, our buildings have been inspected or re-inspected for asbestos-containing materials (ACM). The most recent inspection was conducted on 6/20/2011 in accordance with Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations and DoDEA policy. The results of the inspection indicate we have asbestos materials in our school. This asbestos is contained in the fire door lining inside the elevator doors.

As required by EPA, a triennial re-inspection and six month periodic surveillance program is in effect for any asbestos materials that remain in place and their condition will be closely monitored. A copy of the Asbestos Management Plan, which includes the recommended management response action(s) for ACM, is kept in our office and is available for your review. Parent Connection – Netzaberg Elementary School

Dear Parent or Guardian,

Please join our Parent Connection program, which allows parents/guardians to see grades entered for your student (s) in the teachers' GradeSpeed grading program, attendance information, and a basic school calendar. This letter will help you establish an account. Once you create your account, approval is pending until I verify your information. **This program is for grades 4-12.**

Be sure to log in every so often. A policy is in effect that deletes accounts not accessed after 90 days. I'm not sure how strictly it will be followed, but be aware of the possibility.

If you ever forget your password, I can reset it. **Please do not create an additional account. Contact me and I will help you.** My contact information is at the end of this message. Please save this letter.

It is VERY important that you understand how this program works, so that you have realistic expectations. The electronic teacher grading program is called GradeSpeed. Teachers enter grades into GradeSpeed. They don't enter new electronic grades every day, but they are updated in a reasonable amount of time. Teachers may list assignments before they are due and enter grades after all work is graded.

If your child is missing work, it will usually say "Missing" and it counts as 0% unless the work is completed as to a teacher's grading guidelines. If the teacher hasn't posted grades for an assignment, there may be no grade at that time. Eventually, the grade will appear.

Please keep in mind that the grade you see today may change tomorrow. If you click on a letter grade for a class, you will see a new screen with more detailed information about the grade. If you click on "Assignments", you can view assignments and any attachments the teacher may have added. If you click on the "Calendar" and any noted events, you can keep up with some of our major happenings at school.

Students in grades 4 and 5 are given accounts to the Student Connection program, which allows them to see any grades entered in GradeSpeed. This information is provided to them at school and they see exactly what you see.

Directions:

- Go to <https://dodea.gradespeed.net/pc/> (make this a favorite).
- Click the dropdown to choose "Department of Defense Europe".
- Click where it says "Click Here to Sign Up" in the bottom left area.
- Follow the rest of the directions on the site to create the account.
- Be sure to add your student (child/children) and put in only the information that is required (the phone number sometimes causes a problem and isn't necessary). You can have students from various campuses on one account.

If you have trouble adding your child/children, DO NOT set up another account. Contact me and I will help you.

Once you create an account it will be pending until reviewed, so it is important to write me to let me know you are done.
