This letter serves as the State of Nebraska's comments on the applications received for the second round of grant funding under the Broadband Technology Opportunities Program (BTOP) created by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009.

The seven rural telecommunication providers involved in this project are established companies in Nebraska and understand the needs of their customers and the State.

Project type: Comprehensive Community Infrastructure
