- 205 - Shower mobilizations.
- 166 - Mobile Food mobilizations.
- 1,504 - Crew mobilizations.
- 4 - Military Battalions activations.
- 13,815 - Overhead mobilizations.
- 304 - Air Tanker mobilizations.
- 164 - Type 1 Helicopter mobilizations.
- 269 - Type 2 Helicopter mobilizations.
- 1,210 - Engine mobilizations.
- 336 - Large jet transportation flights.
