The Laboratory is the largest employer in the City of Livermore and the fourth largest employer in Alameda County. We are also one of the largest employers of City of Tracy residents. Our total annual payroll for all employees is just over \$697 million.

Lab employees are active in a broad range of civic, educational, and professional organizations at the local, regional, state, and national levels. They also give generously to the community through extensive volunteer work and charitable donations. Our annual employee charitable fund-raising drive, the HOME (Helping Others More Effectively) Campaign, raised more than \$2 million in employee pledges in 2009.
