## Authorization

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Inspector General is one of the original 12 Inspectors General authorized under the Inspector General Act of 1978. The Office of Inspector General (OIG) is committed to its statutory mission of detecting and preventing fraud, waste, and abuse and promoting the effectiveness and efficiency of government operations. While organizationally located within the Department, the OIG operates independently with separate budget authority. This independence allows for objective reporting to the Secretary and the Congress.

## Mission

## The HUD OIG:

- Promotes the integrity, efficiency and effectiveness of HUD programs and operations to assist the Department in meeting its mission.
- Detects and prevents waste, fraud, and abuse.
- Seeks administrative sanctions, civil recoveries and/or criminal prosecution of those responsible for waste, fraud, and abuse in HUD programs and operations.

- Conducting independent and objective audits, investigations, inspections and evaluations, and other activities relevant to the HUD mission.
- Keeping the Secretary, Congress and the American public fully and currently informed.
- Working collaboratively with HUD staff and program participants to ensure success of HUD program goals.

## Vision

We are a trusted and respected resource for HUD, Congress and the American public in ensuring the integrity, efficiency, and effectiveness of HUD programs and operations. We are committed to working jointly with HUD management to achieve their goal.

#### Overview

The Office of Investigation's Inspections and Evaluations Division (IED) provides the Inspector General (IG) with an alternative means to quickly analyze and evaluate the efficiency or vulnerability of the Department's programs and operations. The division conducts inspections and evaluations using various study methods and evaluative techniques in order to provide timely information to improve policies, programs and procedures.

# **Role of the Inspections and Evaluations Division**

The Director of IED is responsible for conducting short-term management and program evaluations (inspections) that focus on issues of concern to the Department, the Inspector General, Congress, and the public.

The IED function primarily resides in Headquarters, Washington, DC, with staff in Regions II and III. The division is managed by a Director and a Deputy Director. Region II staff are supervised by a Supervisory Forensic Auditor.

IED activities are designed to promote: economy, efficiency and effectiveness in the administration of HUD's programs, detect and deter fraud and abuse in programs and operations, and ensure compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

## **Work Planning Process**

In developing the annual work plan, we considered statutory requirements for OIG reviews, as set forth in the Inspector General Act of 1978, as amended, regulations, or other directives; Inspector General and senior management requests; Congressional and Departmental requests; management and performance challenges facing the Department; OIG strategic plan; and Office of Investigation priorities.

This annual work plan is prepared to provide a framework for the focus of inspection and evaluation resources for the fiscal year. The plan is designed to be flexible. It may be modified during the year to accommodate higher priority assignments or other services determined by the OIG or requested by the Department, or other OIG clients.
