# Consumption

Americans use 25% more home energy (electric and heat) than their Italian neighbors

# Gas and Electric Facts

- Americans are not charged more for electricity.
- There are, however, 3 different levels of electric charge for all consumers, Italian and American, depending on what wattage electric line you have running to your house.
  - 3.0kW Normal Italian Home pays the cheapest rate
  - 4.5kW Some Americans opt for this wattage and you pay a higher rate
  - 6.0 kW Many Americans opt for the highest wattage, and pay the highest rate.
- Another Variable –you can choose a fixed annual usage rate, or a rate that varies by time of usage and seasonal prices.
  - If you choose a fixed annual rate, you will pay the same rate all year, any time of day.
  - If you choose the variable rate, you will be charged less or more depending on time of day, and the base rate will change every 3 months depending on how much energy costs.
- The Variable Rate times each day are:
  - Cheapest Evenings and Weekends
  - Most Expensive Day Time on Weekdays

# The UTEP Advantage

- UTEP is a service provided by the garrison. This service costs you money, but almost certainly saves you even more money.
- Bottomline if you join UTEP, then you do not have to pay the 38-48% variable Government Tax on the natural gas or oil you burn to heat your home.
- The annual fee of \$232 (billed quarterly) pays for garrison personnel to administer the program.
- Will you benefit from UTEP?
  - If your annual gas bill after tax is: \$580.00, you will break even.
  - If your annual gas bill after tax is: Under \$580.00 (really?) then you will lose money.
  - If your annual gas bill after tax is: \$3000, then you will save \$968 a year.
  - If your annual gas bill after tax is: 3000 Euro, then you will save \$1368 per year.

## "How not to get surprised by a 5000 Euro gas bill . . . "

- Italian Gas companies do not read meters and bill monthly like in the US.
- It is not unusual for meters to be read once a year and sometimes it can be longer.
- During the time between meter readings, the gas company will bill you an estimate. These estimates can be WAY off, and you could end up having a giant bill when the meter is finally read and you receive an actual bill.
- Keeping ahead is easy -2 simple steps:
  - 1. Don't spend your monthly utilities allowance on shoes or beer save it for your utilities. (Tip: Set up a separate savings account for Utilities and have a great Christmas)
  - 2. Read your gas meter every month, go to UTEP and give them the reading, and they will charge your for your actual usage.
- Note: The Electric company does bill regularly every other month.

- Tire Chains and Maintenance









#### Info X

•Italian Law as of 2012 indicates that the owner of the road, can require that vehicles are equipped with snow tires/all season tires or have snow chains in the car.

The agency or road owner will inform drivers about this requirement by posting the sign below

requirement by posting the sign below.

 This sign means you must have snow chains in your vehicle or 4 winter/snow/all season tires mounted on your vehicle 15 Nov to 01 April.


•4 Wheel Drive vehicles are not exempt from this policy.

#### Info X

 In Europe only the tires with the following symbols are certified:

> M&S, MS, M-S, M+S.

•The **SNOWFLAKE** is only for the American market.





## **Additional Information**

- You are subject to being fined or could be liable for accidents if you do not have the proper tires or equipment.
- The official web site for more information is "Polizia di Stato" <a href="http://www.poliziadistato.it">http://www.poliziadistato.it</a>. The section "Viabilita' Italia" lists roads where chains or winter tires are mandatory and more specific dates.
- If traveling to Austria and Germany 15 Nov. to 01 April ensure that your vehicle has winter/allseason tires and be prepared to use snow chains if weather conditions require them.

# Medical and Dental Care for Dependents Under 18

#### Info X

- (1) A minor is any person less than 18 years of age.
- (2) Policy: General rule is minors between the ages of 15 and 18 may consent to their own medical care if the health care provider judges the minor to be sufficiently mature to understand the problem.
- (3) Minors can not consent to any care that requires written informed consent.
- (4) Parental consent is required before non-emergency medical care for minors under 15 years of age.
- (5) Invasive procedures will ALWAYS require parental presence during care.
