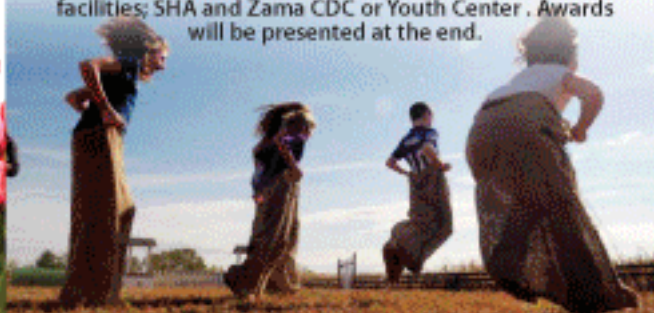

TIP Do you want to save money and gas while you are driving? Make sure your tires are inflated properly. Thousands of dollars are wasted due to low or improper tire pressure. The vehicle manufacturer will have a sticker / placard in one of the door sills, normally on the driver's side or in the owner's manual. If your vehicle does not have one and you cannot find it in the owner's manual or online, the rule of thumb is 32 psi. This is an average of all passenger vehicle tire pressure recommendations. NOTE: SUV's and trucks usually require a higher tire pressure. Again, look at the door sill or owner manual or online.
