POTENTIAL VISITOR DELAYS AT FORT SHAFTER, TRIPLER

FORT SHAFTER, Hawaii—Army officials are asking for visitors’ patience as they transition to a new visitor processing system at the Fort Shafter and Tripler Army Medical Center Visitor Control Centers (VCC), beginning May 19.

The new digital system, which is already in place at Schofield Barracks’ Lyman Gate VCC, allows U.S. Army Garrison-Hawaii to process installation visitor passes more efficiently while enhancing security.

During this transition period, visitors may encounter potential delays at the VCC and should allow extra travel time, especially during morning and peak traffic hours, when accessing Fort Shafter or TAMC.

In order to obtain a visitor pass at the VCCs, non-military ID card holders must present a valid driver’s license, vehicle safety inspection, vehicle registration and proof insurance.
