# **From the Director**



It is an honor to have been appointed as Network Director of the VA Sierra Pacific Network - VISN 21, a Network I have been a part of for over 20 years. In this position, I have the opportunity to not only follow the outstanding leadership of former Network Director, Dr. Robert Wiebe, but also to direct one of the most vibrant and innovative health care Networks in the VA system. This is an exciting time and I look forward to building upon the excellence for which VISN 21 is recognized!

In early May 2008, Dr. Wiebe left the VA for a position with Catholic Healthcare West, where he was appointed as Chief Medical Officer. Dr. Wiebe's VA career spanned 22 years, in which the last 10 years were served as the Network Director, VISN 21. It is with great pride that I follow Dr. Wiebe as Network Director. Our Network provides health care to veterans throughout Northern California, Northern Nevada and Hawaii. Operating with a budget of over \$1.4 billion and employing nearly 9,000 staff members, the Network is comprised of six medical centers, eight community living centers, and 32 communitybased outpatient clinics. We are home to a number of specialty programs including one of VA's Polytrauma Rehabilitation Centers and VA's largest funded research program.

The VA has consistently been ranked higher than many private health care systems in all aggregate quality of care measures and is a leader in customer satisfaction surveys. In our Network, we have not only exceeded (inpatient and outpatient) satisfaction thresholds, but our employee satisfaction scores are among the highest in the country. This means that we have a dedicated and satisfied workforce that is committed to ensuring that the care veterans receive is of the highest quality.

As we move forward, access to care for all veterans will continue to be a primary focus, with special emphasis placed on ready availability of services for our newest generation of veterans. We will continue to ensure that our **Operation Enduring Freedom and** Operation Iraqi Freedom veterans receive timely access to care and that the care they (and all veterans) receive is second to none. Also we continue to develop specialized programs for women veterans, as their numbers increase and special needs emerge.

We greatly expanded access to mental health services at all sites supporting a comprehensive array of specialized care including; PTSD, substance abuse, homelessness, island locations is also a priority. As we move forward, the VA Sierra Pacific Network will identify new opportunities for rural outreach through the use of part-time outreach clinics, community partnerships and collaborations, telehealth, and mobile health teams.


Finally, we will continue to insure a safe and energy efficient environment of care by maximizing the effectiveness of our capital and technological infrastructure.



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VA Sierra Pacific Network is one of 21 Veterans Integrated Service Networks (VISN) within the Veterans Health Administration (VHA). Known as "VISN 21" the VA Sierra Pacific Network is a large and geographically diverse service area, spanning nearly 500,000 square miles with a veteran population exceeding one million. This area includes central and northern California, northern Nevada, Hawaii, the Philippines, and several other islands in the Pacific, including Guam, American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands and the Republic of Palau. The VISN 21 geography is characterized by varied terrain and climates: high mountains, deserts, valleys, coastal regions, frontier land, and remote islands. Currently, VISN 21 facilities support over 320,000 enrollees, with health care services provided to more than 236,000 patients per year at 40 sites of care and a total medical care budget exceeding \$1.6 billion.

The VA Sierra Pacific Network (VISN 21) operates six major health care systems and an international VA independent outpatient clinic. Information on each of these health care systems follows.

VISN 21 has a proactive quality management program, which ensures that facilities provide a predictable and consistent level of high quality care through the systematic and ongoing evaluation and monitoring of patient care outcomes. The VA Sierra Pacific Network is also recognized for its stellar academic affiliations and cutting edge research programs that directly attribute to its success. All six health care systems are teaching hospitals, affiliated with medical schools known for academic excellence. VISN 21 continues to rank among the top of all Veterans Health Administration (VHA) Networks in research funding, with San Francisco VA Medical Center ranking at the top (of all VHA facilities) for more than a decade. VISN 21 research is conducted in areas of particular importance to veterans' health care, most recently with a focus towards the needs of combat veterans returning from Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF) and Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF).

The VA Sierra Pacific Network is also very proud of its association with colleagues from the Department of Defense, and the Network has one of the largest and most active VA-DoD joint venture programs in the country. At the VA Palo Alto Health Care System, the Network operates one of four national VA Polytrauma Rehabilitation Centers established to meet the most complex healthcare needs of America's returning wounded warriors serving in Iraq and Afghanistan.

# VA Central California Health Care System

The VA Central California Health Care System (VACCHCS) at Fresno, is a 57-bed acute general medical, surgical, psychiatric and extended care center with state-of-the-art diagnostic and treatment specializations. Extensive outpatient services are provided in a managed care environment with numerous specialty care clinics including Women's Health and at community clinics in Merced and Tulare. A 60-bed Community Living Center provides skilled nursing and rehabilitation care.

VA Central California Healthcare System has been nationally recognized for its diversity and labor management relations programs and has been recognized as a Top 100 Most Wired facility for the last two years. VACCHCS was fully successful in all 14 mission critical measures during FY2009. VA Central California consistently exceeded both ORYX and HEDIS Aggregate targets. The high level of achievement is the culmination of many years of improvements and steadfast monitoring of performance across the spectrum of care, specifically making significant improvements in Access and Missed Opportunities in FY2009.

VA Pacific Islands Health Care System The VA Pacific Islands Health Care System (VAPIHCS) Honolulu provides a broad range of medical care services, serving an estimated 127,600 veterans throughout Hawaii and the Pacific Islands. The VAPIHCS provides outpatient medical and mental health care through a main Ambulatory Care Clinic on Oahu (Honolulu), six Community Based Outpatient Clinics (CBOCs), and two Outreach Clinics on the neighboring Hawaiian islands including: Hawaii (Hilo and Kona), Maui, Kauai, Molokai, Lanai, and on Guam and American Samoa. A new Oahu Leeward Coast CBOC, and Saipan, Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas, (CNMI) Outreach Clinic, will be established in FY2010.

The main VA Pacific Islands health care facility is co-located with the Tripler Army Medical Center Campus in Oahu. This collocation made possible the significant functional integration between VAPIHCS and Tripler Army Medical Center. Our current level of functional integration offers substantial opportunities to provide high quality care to federal beneficiaries residing in Hawaii and the Pacific region.

# VA Northern California Health Care System

VA Northern California Health Care System has two divisions, each with an Associate Director. The Sacramento Valley Division is comprised of medical facilities in Sacramento, Yuba City, Yreka, Chico and Redding. The East Bay Division is comprised of medical facilities in Fairfield, Vallejo, Martinez and Oakland. Facilities include a medical center in Sacramento a Community Living Center in Martinez; outpatient clinics in Martinez, Fairfield, Oakland, Sacramento, Redding, Chico, Vallejo and Yreka; a Behavioral Health Clinic in Oakland; and dental clinics in Vallejo, Sacramento, and Redding.

The Sacramento VA Medical Center offers a full range of comprehensive health care services. The medical center houses a cardiac catheterization lab, a gastrointestinal/ endoscopy suite, angiography capability, radiology services including MRI, mammography, PET and CT scanning, four operating rooms, and 16,000 square feet of research laboratory.

In January 2010, a rural outreach clinic opened in Yreka, California, which provides primary care, mental health care, laboratory and routine radiology services to our Veterans. In addition, a new Community Based Outpatient Clinic in the Yuba City/Marysville area of California has been approved for activation in FY10.

Additionally, there are four Vet Centers located within the VAPAHCS catchment area.

VAPAHCS is home to a variety of regional treatment centers, including a Spinal Cord Injury Center; a Polytrauma Rehabilitation Center; the Western Blind Rehabilitation Center; a Geriatric Research, Educational and Clinical Center; a Homeless Veterans Rehabilitation Center program and the Men's and Women's Trauma Recovery Programs.

As one of the four Polytrauma Rehabilitation Centers in the United States, VAPAHCS cares for Veterans with multiple injuries, including combat-injured service members from Iraq and Afghanistan.

The VAPAHCS Research Program is one of the largest research programs in VA.

# VA Sierra Nevada Health Care System

VASNHCS provides a wide array of inpatient and outpatient services in medicine, surgery, women's health, mental health, interventional cardiology and radiology, neurology, pharmacy, alcohol/drug treatment, eye care, audiology/ speech pathology, dental, and home care. A wide range of diagnostic services, including MRI, CT, ultrasound, nuclear medicine, and diagnostic cardiac catheterization services are available. Geriatrics and Extended Care includes, rehabilitation, skilled care, palliative care, respite, geriatrics evaluation, transitional care, and long-term care. Tertiary and unique specialty care not available at VASNHCS is supported in a variety of ways, including referrals to local hospitals and VA Medical Centers in San Francisco and Palo Alto. VASNHCS plans to open a CBOC in Susanville, CA in FY 2010, the VA Diamond View Community Based Outpatient Clinic, serving Lassen, Modoc, and Plumas counties. A Rural Outreach Clinic is also scheduled to open in the Winnemucca, NV area in 2010, providing primary care services to veterans in Humboldt, Lander, and Pershing counties.

The Medical Center has 124 operating beds and a 120-bed Community Living Center. Primary and mentalhealthcareisprovided at community based outpatient clinics in: Santa Rosa, Eureka, Ukiah, and San Bruno. There is a specialized homeless Veterans clinic in downtown San Francisco. SFVAMC has five National Centers of Excellence: The Center of Excellence for Epilepsy Treatment, Cardiac Surgery, Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, HIV, and Renal Dialysis. It has nationally recognized programs including: The Parkinson's Disease Research, Education and Clinical Center, the Hepatitis C Research and Education Center, the Mental Illness Research & Education Clinical Center, and the Western Pacemaker and AICD Surveillance Program.

SFVAMC has the largest funded research programs in the Veterans Health Administration with \$76 million annual research budget. Through its non-profit research corporation NCIRE - The Veterans Health Research Institute, SFVAMC has established a unique partnership with the Department of Defense (DoD) to study the basic neuroscience and neuroimaging of combat-related brain and spinal cord injuries, PTSD and other neurological combat-related injuries. This program is considered a national resource by the DoD and is referred to as the SFVAMC/DoD/ NCIRE Neuroscience Center of Excellence.

# VA Regional Office and Outpatient Clinic, Manila, Philippines

The VA Regional Office (VARO) & Outpatient Clinic (OPC), Manila the only VA activity located in a foreign country. A VA office has been in operation in the Philippines continuously since the U.S. Veterans Bureau was opened in 1922 (except during the Japanese occupation of WW II), and it is an integral part of the United States' mission to the Republic of the Philippines.

The OPC consists of a standalone ambulatory care leased facility, which is located about two miles south of the U.S. Embassy, where the VARO is located. The OPC will be relocated to a state of the art facility at the US Embassy Seafront Compound that will colocate VARO & OPC functions to better serve Veterans. The OPC provides ambulatory care to service-connected U.S. military veterans for their service-connected and non service-connected disabilities and conducts compensation and pension examinations for eligibility purposes. In 2002, of Public Law 106-377 expanded health care coverage to include treatment for the non service-connected disabilities of service-connected U.S. military veterans was enacted.

Health care services are provided at the OPC by primary care staff physicians and by contracted specialist consultants. Outpatient services include general medicine; internal medicine with multiple subspecialties, ancillary services, and support services. Inpatient and fee basis outpatient care is limited to treatment of service-connected conditions and is provided through fee-based arrangements with accredited medical facilities and private health care providers in their community.
