EXCELLENCE - Knowledge, Commitment and Professionalism



Our specialists provide financial and technical assistance for the transfer of defense materiel, training and services to friendly and allied nations, and build long-term military-to-military relationships. They interact with U.S. and foreign leaders helping to shape U.S. foreign policy.

We also manage and coordinate DoD's foreign disaster relief and humanitarian assistance missions. Our employees work with the Combatant Commands to distribute humanitarian daily rations (HDRs) and DoD's non-lethal property to people in need worldwide.
