NEW INTERACTIVE MAP HELPS TELL THE JOB CORPS STORY

The Office of Job Corps has recently released three user-friendly tools for the public to improve program data transparency: 1) the Job Corps Performance Management System Overview Guide; 2) the Job Corps Performance Results At-a-Glance (an interactive map) and 3) the performance results video, which provides easy step by step instructions for using the map. The Performance Management System Overview Guide provides an overview of Job Corps' performance management system. The Performance Results At-a-Glance (interactive map) details Job Corps center outcome results based on Job Corps' Outcome Measurement System in Program Year (PY) 2010 (July 1, 2010 – June 30, 2011). Users can select any state on the interactive map to view center performance information within that state. Alternatively, users can select links for each state. Job Corps is committed to providing user-friendly information about the program to interested persons.
