### NCOA<sup>Link®</sup> Software Developer Certification Procedures

Attention Developers: Developer is prohibited from representing to third parties that USPS has certified Developer's software product until USPS issues a software certification notice to Developer as described in Step 4, below. Prior to receiving the software certification notice from USPS, Developer may only represent that it has "applied" to receive software certification, and is prohibited from making any representations or warranties as to the availability of its software to support the NCOA<sup>Link</sup> product.

A certification package must be completed for each individual site involved in development of interface software.

Full requirements are set forth in the USPS NCOA<sup>Link</sup> License Agreements and related documents. In the event of a conflict between this document and the standard NCOA<sup>Link</sup> License Agreement, the terms of the NCOA<sup>Link</sup> License Agreement prevail.

The following material describes the process for a Developer to qualify for a license and certify an NCOA<sup>Link</sup> software interface. Information for each step of the certification process is included.

### Step 1. Application and Self-Certification Statement Approval

The following documentation must be completed and submitted by Developer and approved by the USPS:

- Application
- Confidentiality Statement
- Self-Certification Statement
- Key Personnel Listing
- Security Documentation

USPS will notify Developer if it determines that Developer has completed Step 1 to the satisfaction of USPS.

### Step 2. Software Development

Upon successful completion of Step 1 as evidenced by USPS's issuance of a notice to Developer, USPS will forward a standard NCOA<sup>Link</sup> Software Development License Agreement ("License Agreement") for signature. **The NCOA<sup>Link</sup> License Agreement must be signed by an** officer who possesses the necessary legal authority to sign on behalf of the company, firm, or organization. Upon receipt of the original signed NCOA<sup>Link</sup> Software Developer License Agreement, the USPS Contracting Officer's Representative will execute the license agreement

and a copy of the executed license agreement will be mailed to the Developer via Priority Mail<sup>®</sup>. An invoice in the amount of \$5,600.00 will be mailed separately.

Payment must be received within ten (10) calendar days from receipt of the executed license agreement. Once payment is received USPS will Priority Mail<sup>®</sup> the Software Developer Kit (SDK) to the new NCOA<sup>Link</sup> Developer.

The SDK will include a Software Developer Guide (SDG), sample code and sample data to facilitate software development. Developer's software interface must meet the requirements set forth in the SDG and the Software Performance Requirements (SPR). USPS will provide Developer with SPR for USPS Full Service, Limited Service and End User NCOA<sup>Link</sup> product Licensees. Refer to the specific SPR for the service level that will be utilizing the software.

An NCOA<sup>Link</sup> Stage I test file will be available for testing through the assigned internet account. This file will contain test questions and the expected answers.

# NOTE: All source code designed to access the secure data store technology of NCOA<sup>Link</sup> shall be considered Confidential Information and is subject to the provisions of the Confidentiality Statement.

### Step 3. NCOA<sup>Link</sup> Testing & Certification

Developer must submit to USPS a written request and a Software Product Information Form requesting that USPS perform an NCOA<sup>Link</sup> certification test. The USPS will notify Developer when it has sent a test file. (While NCOA<sup>Link</sup> testing will usually occur remotely, USPS reserves the right to perform testing on-site and/or request a copy of Developer's software interface for testing purposes.)

The following items are tested in Step 3:

- Ability to correctly process test files
- Ability to provide new addresses in accordance with NCOA<sup>Link</sup> product requirements
- Ability to produce output file with appended flags
- Understanding and performance of administrative requirements which includes processing the certification test and submitting the proper paper work and/or reports.

If USPS determines that Developer fails the initial certification test, Developer may submit to USPS a written request for an additional certification test. USPS will require payment of \$1,100.00 for each additional certification test.

### Step 4. USPS Interface Certification

Upon USPS determining that Developer has successfully completed Steps 1 - 3, USPS will issue a software certification notice to Developer.

Developer's NCOA<sup>Link</sup> interface software MAY NOT be used, sold and/or distributed for use unless the party using Developer's NCOA<sup>Link</sup> interface software has entered into a standard NCOA<sup>Link</sup> product license agreement with USPS. In the event Developer desires to sell or distribute its software to third parties, Developer must enter into a separate license agreement with USPS.
