### Pacific Northwest Storms Situation Report # 6 December 20, 2006 (3:00 PM EST)

# Summary

### **Highlights:**

Significant progress has been made in restoring power to customers in the Pacific Northwest region. Currently, 134,868 customers remain without power. The number of outages is down from 1.8 million customers who lost power following severe wind and snow storms on December 14-15, 2006. The customers without power represent less than 5 percent of customers in the affected utility service areas of Oregon and Washington. The majority of customers without power are served by Puget Sound Energy and Seattle City Light. See table below.

#### **Restoration Efforts:**

Puget Sound Energy (PSE) has 496 crews deployed in the field making repairs to the transmission system. As of this morning (12/20/06), power has been restored to more than 82 percent (580,000) of the customers who lost power from the storms. PSE believes that most customers still without power will have their service back no later than Friday or Saturday. PSE reports that 90 percent of the remaining outages exist in King County, the hardest-hit area from the storm. PSE states power may not be restored until Sunday or early next week for customers within the Cottage Lake area, east of Woodinville, and outlying areas around Duvall. PSE also reports that 158 of the 159 substations that lost power from the storms have been re-energized and plans to restore the last substation by later today. A total of 70 of the 85 damaged transmission lines that lost power have been restored.

Seattle City Light reports twelve crews arrived on Tuesday (12/19/06) from PacifiCorp's locations in Yakima, Portland and other sites from throughout the Northwest to aid Seattle City Light in its customer restoration efforts.

Snohomish County PUD reports that they are down to their last 36 crew jobs, from a peak of 623.

At 11:40 am PST (12/20/06), Portland General Electric (PGE) PGE declared the power outage related to last Thursday night's wind storm to be over.
