Days of infamy

Pearl Harbor connects to 9/11

NORCO - James Lee vividly remembers Dec. 7, 1941.

Lee, then 18 years old, was an Army tech sergeant in the 8th Coast Artillery Regiment stationed at Schofield Barracks near Pearl Harbor.

After a night of hula dancing, friends woke Lee and asked if he would attend church with them.

Then, the Japanese warplanes attacked.

"All of a sudden, here come eight airplanes, and the ground started shaking," Lee said. "We looked toward Pearl Harbor and we could see the flames and the smoke, and the ships were blowing up.³

Lee, shared his story on Tuesday with hundreds of people at the Pearl Harbor Remembrance Ceremony at the Naval Surface Warfare Center.

Lee told attendees about how survivors of the attack swam into the harbor to retrieve bodies of servicemen who had been killed.

After the 90-minute attack, 2,386 Americans were killed, 1,139 were wounded and 18 ships were sunk or run aground.

Parallels were drawn at the ceremony between Pearl Harbor and the Šept. 11 terrorist attacks.

Frank de Boer, battalion chief of the Norco Fire Department, was part of a search and rescue task force from California that searched Lee was among a handful of for survivors at Ground Zero in

New York City.

"I've had 34 years in the fire service, and, by far, it's the proudest moment I've ever had to be able to respond and help," de Boer said. "We did do our job and I think we did it well."

The ceremony also featured the Navy band, color guards, Norco High School Air Force ROTC drill team as well as a warplane flyover.

Ovitt asks for motto 'In God We Trust' proposed

San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors Chairman Gary Ovitt is proposing that the "In God We Trust" motto be displayed behind the dais in board chambers at the County Government Center.

During the board's meeting Tuesday, Ovitt announced that he will present a resolution to the board at its next meeting on Dec. 14.

"Americans are struggling in their lives right now. We have a stagnant economy in California, and people find themselves looking for places to bolster their faith and spirit," Ovitt said during the meeting. "A relatively simple act like posting "In God We Trust" helps to show citizens that we are acting on the principles that have grounded our nation through good times and bad times.'

In the past four years, cities including Chino Hills, Chino and Ontario have chosen to display "In God We Trust" in their council chambers.

Ovitt's spokesman, Burt Southard,

said the display would likely withstand legal challenges that it would violate separation of church and state."

The establishment clause of the First Amendment precludes government from creating its own church but does not prohibit references to God, Southard said.

"We've used 'In God We Trust' on U.S. currency since 1864, and it was added to the Pledge of Allegiance in 1954, then it became a motto of the U.S. on July 30, 1956," Southard said.

That doesn't necessarily mean that bringing God into government chambers on a mass scale is a good thing, said Robert Boston, a senior policy analyst for the Washington, D.C.based Americans United for the Separation of Church and State.

'In God We Trust' may seem very general, but it still puts the county in the position where it is taking a stand on a theological controversy, and that's not really government's job," Boston said.
