Family finally gets to pay respects

Capt. Jay Kadowaki, commanding officer of the Naval Surface Warfare Center in Norco, has an image burning in his mind — a photograph of him with his 21-year-old uncle in uniform.

Days after that picture was taken around Christmas 1967, a 4-year-old Jay Kadowaki would go back to preschool, and his uncle would go off to war. Little did the voungster know then, but this would be one of the last times he and his family would be together with his uncle.

A few weeks after that holiday gathering in St. Louis, Pfc. Robert "Bobby" Kadowaki would be in heavy, hand-to-hand, combat with insurgents in Vietnam. He would be wounded in combat, and he would distinguish himself with heroism and bravery. He would be awarded two Purple Hearts, a Bronze Star and a Silver
