Historian's book tells of 'The Navy in Norco'

A Norco city councilman and historian has for years studied the Norconian Hotel and the history of the U.S. Navy ensconced there since 1941, and his new book "The Navy in Norco" tells the history of the military in Norco. The book is one of the "Images of America" series by Arcadia Press books.

Bash said the Navy buildings represent the last A naval hospital operated for many years at the Norconian. standing naval hospital in the U.S.

"In writing this book, I wanted to honor the Navy," said Bash.

Research discovered that many leading-edge treatments of the day were first tested, such as penicillin and streptomycin.

In mid-1941, the federal government under President Franklin Roosevelt began negotiations to buy the \$2 million to build a naval hospital.

"On Dec. 3, the first appraisal came in, and on Dec. 6, the purchase was completed for \$2.25 million," said Bash.

The next day, the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, which led to the United States declaring war on Japan and entering World War II. Bash said the naval

A LOOK BACK

After the war and the polio scare passed, the hospital was closed in 1949. When the Korean War began, the hospital was reopened. The Bureau of Standards wanted a missile research facility at the site, and one was added that year and continues there today.

Once again, the hospital closed in 1957. In 1963, the land was divided, with 94 acres deeded for the California Rehabilitation Center for drug addicts.

It is part of the state prison system today.


