CSM James Spencer serves as Command Sergeant Major of the U.S. Army Sustainment Command (ASC), a position he has held since January 2012. As Command Sergeant Major, CSM Spencer leads a global organization responsible for sustaining Army and Joint Forces in the US and abroad in support of combatant commanders. CSM Spencer serves as the primary advisor to the ASC Commanding General on all matters pertaining to enlisted personnel assigned to the Command, particularly in areas related to their training and development and to the quality of life and well-being of Soldiers and their families. CSM Spencer also responds to the concerns of civilian and contractor employees of the Command, and performs community outreach activities.



Command Sgt. Maj. James E. Spencer, a native of Humbolt, Tenn., entered the United States Army on May 28 1986. He completed Basic Combat Training at Fort Dix, N.J., and Advanced Individual Training at Fort Lee, Va. He has held various leadership and operations positions, to include Squad Leader, Platoon Sergeant, Detachment Noncommissioned Officer-in-Charge, First Sergeant, Operations Sergeant Major, and Command Sergeant Major.

His stateside assignments include: 194th Armored Division, Fort Knox, Ky.; 7th Special Forces Group, Fort Bragg, N.C.; United States Army Office of Military Support, Washington, DC; United States Army Sergeants Major Academy, Fort Bliss, Texas. His overseas assignments include: Headquarters and Headquarters Company 197th Ordnance Battalion, 59th Ordnance Brigade, Pirmasens, Germany; 1st Battalion, 10th Special Forces Group, Stuttgart, Germany; 16th Sustainment Brigade, Bamberg, Germany; and 21st Theater Sustainment Command, Kaiserslautern, Germany.

His military schools and education include the Basic Airborne Course, Air Assault Course, Static Line Jumpmaster Course, Joint Personnel Recovery Agency Course, Warrior Leaders Course, Advanced and Senior Leaders Course, Battle Staff Course, and First Sergeant Course. He is a graduate of the United States Army Sergeants Major Academy, Class 54 and the Command Sergeants Major Course Class 04-04. He has a Bachelors of Science Degree in Management and Human Resources from Park University and a Masters of Business/Project Management from Columbia Southern.
