Blue Steel is the premier commercial popular music ensemble of the United States Air Force Academy Band. Various line-ups of Blue Steel have been in operation for more than thirty years, enhancing community relations and supporting the recruiting mission of the USAF Academy and the United States Air Force. Blue Steel's mission also includes deployment, military support and troop morale. Currently, Blue Steel is made up of seven elite musicians that perform high energy music from a variety of genres. Blue Steel's versatile performers capture audiences with pop music, classic rock, country music and original compositions. Whether on a flight line in the desert, high school gymnasium, large concert hall or a national sporting event, Blue Steel has the ability to create the ideal atmosphere for any performance venue or setting.



First Lieutenant Jason S. Plosch was born and raised in Clinton, Iowa. He attended the University of Iowa, Iowa City, Iowa where he graduated with honors and received his Bachelor of Music degree in 1995. In 1998, he acquired a Master of Music degree from Penn State University, State College, Pennsylvania.

Lieutenant Plosch enlisted in the United States Air Force in July 2001 and began his first assignment

as a trumpeter with the USAF Band of Flight, Wright-Patterson AFB, OH in September 2001. As an enlisted member of the USAF Band of Flight, he performed in seven different ensembles and was versatile in all styles of music. He was a member of the first USAF brass ensemble, Hot Brass, to deploy to Southwest Asia in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom. In 2008, Lieutenant Plosch was commissioned through the Officer Training School at Maxwell AFB, Alabama where he was a Distinguished Graduate. Afterward, he became the deputy commander of the USAF Academy Band in August 2008, and later assumed command in February 2012.

Lieutenant Plosch's professional credits include work at Disneyland, Anaheim, California and Tokyo Disneyland, Tokyo, Japan. He also performed with Princess Cruise Lines as well as serving as a high school instrumental director in Centerville, Iowa for three years. His ensembles consistently garnered the highest ratings during his tenure in Centerville. Lieutenant Plosch has also been involved with many regional orchestras in Iowa, Ohio and Pennsylvania. He has performed with such artists as Aretha Franklin, The Manhattan Transfer, Bernadette Peters, Lou Rawls, Byron Stripling and many others.

Lieutenant Plosch's military awards and decorations include the Air Force Commendation Medal with one oak leaf cluster, the Air Force Achievement Medal, the National Defense Service medal, the Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, and the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal. He was chosen the USAF Band of Flight Airman of the Year in 2002 and NCO of the Year in 2007. He was named the Air Force Sergeant's Association Kittyhawk Chapter 751 Bandsman of the Year for 2002. He is also the USAF Academy's Company Grade Officer of the Year for 2009.


