SFC Jeremy Davis is a native of Palm Bay, FL and attended Basic Training at Fort Jackson, South Carolina in 1997 and then attended Advanced Individual Training at the U.S. Army School of Music in the same year where he obtained the MOS of 42R9E, Trombone Player. His duty assignments include: Platoon Sergeant, Drum Major, and Squad Leader with the 82nd Airborne Division “All-American” Band; Platoon Sergeant, Operations Supervisor, and Drum Major with the 2nd Infantry Division “Warrior” Band; MPT ‘E’ Leader, Operations / Training Section NCOIC, and Senior Resource Management NCO with the U.S. Army Materiel Command Band; Small Group Leader - Senior Leaders Course - Army Band NCO Academy; and he currently serves as the Deputy Commandant for the Army Band NCO Academy. He has also deployed in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom with the 82nd Band and the AMC Band.
