## When Spotter Obs are needed:

**Damaging Dust Devils** 

**Funnel Clouds or Tornados** 

**Strong Thunderstorms** or even strong showers with any of these:

Damaging winds,

Hail greater than 1/4 inch diameter

Significant rainfall in a short amount of time (see below)

## **Heavy rainfall** anytime, such as

More than .50 Inch or more in 1 hour More than .75 Inch or more in 3 hours More than 1.00 Inch or more in 6 hours

**Flooding** - Swollen Rivers due to rain, snow-melt or ice jam blockage:

Roads impassable due to high water

Streams or Rivers <u>overflowing</u> their banks - any occurring or potential property damage?

<u>Mudslides</u> - Roads fully or partially blocked, property destroyed/damaged

Breakup - The FIRST occurrence when ice on the river is breaking up and moving.

**Strong Wind** that causes damage, even occurring without a thunderstorm (e.g. blew items some distance away). *Report wind speeds of 35 mph or more.* 

## **Heavy Snowfall** anytime, such as

At least three inches in 12 hours or less.

**Freezing Drizzle**, or **Freezing Rain**: an estimation of the amount of ice accumulation on the road or surface (some fraction of an inch).

**Low Visibilities: in Blowing Snow** – 1 mile or less – please try to estimate. **in Fog** – 1 mile or less – please try to estimate

Wind Chill Values of -40 or colder...with average wind speeds 15 mph or greater.
