The Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: a Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU, P.L. 109-59), authorized \$290 million in FY 2008 contract authority for the Public Lands Highways (PLH) Program. As defined in 23 USC 202(b), 66 percent (\$191,400,000) of the PLH program is to be allocated to the Forest Highway Program. This amount was reduced by 7.6 percent (\$14,546,400) in accordance with Section 1102(f) of the SAFETEA-LU for obligation limitation reduction. An additional \$3,960,000 has been dedicated for Transportation Planning purposes in accordance with 23 USC 204(i)(2), and \$9,975,920 has been dedicated for Aquatic Organism Passage projects in accordance with Section 1119(m) of SAFETEA-LU. Of this resulting FH subtotal of \$162,917,680, additional reductions are made in FY 2008 for Forest Service (FS) administration of the FH program (\$2,120,000), Special Studies (\$30,000), and Federal Lands Highway (FLH) Program Coordinated Technology Implementation Program/FS Engineering Technology and Development Program activities (\$803,988).

The resulting \$159,963,692.00 is the net FY 2008 funding made available for the FH engineering/construction program. The program code for FH funds is PC-F150. As in previous years, FH contract authority will be allocated with equal amounts of obligation limitation to the FLH Division offices. The FLH Headquarters Office will continue to require periodic updates by the FLH Divisions on the status of FH funds.



This memorandum provides program information on the amount of new engineering/construction contract authority being made available for FY 2008 for the FH category under the PLH Program. The FY 2008 amounts for engineering/construction programs are in accordance with Section 202 of Title 23, as amended by Section 1119(d) of SAFETEA-LU (same as the final rule published in the Federal Register, dated October 12, 1984). The attached Table A shows the \$159,963,692 in FY 2008 contract authority distributed on a FS regional basis to allow the flexibility required to meet funding and scheduling needs. Table A also shows the contract authority for FH funds by State area within the FS regions.

Please inform your respective State Department of Transportation (DOT) of the amounts of FH funds that will be available for obligation by FS region and State boundary. Table B shows the FH funds distribution based on State boundaries to account for those States that fall into more than one FS region. Table C lists these same amounts by FLH Division boundaries. Please note that FH funding is obligated in Delphi by the FLH Division offices; it will not appear in the Financial Management Information System.

Under existing regulations (23 CFR 660A), the FS, State DOT, and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) jointly develop a multi-year priority program of projects. A list of FH projects to be included in the Statewide Transportation Improvement Programs is annually updated and distributed after each tri-agency (FS/State DOT/FHWA) program meeting.
