#### Northern fur seal, Callorhinus ursinus

- Found in the North Pacific and Bering Sea
- Spends a majority of the year at sea
- Spends the rest of the year on rookeries, breeding grounds (May-November)
- Most births occur in late June and early July




#### Rookeries (breeding grounds)



- On islands in Russia and the United States
- Largest portion of the worldwide population return to the Pribilof Islands during the breeding season
- Strong tendency to return to rookeries where they were born

#### Pribilof Islands, Alaska

- Located in the eastern BeringSea
- 2 main islands
  - St. Paul
  - St. George




#### Human Influences

- Their rich pelt led to the commercial harvest of this species (1700s–1984)
- Pelagic sealing and harvests of females caused significant fluctuations in the world population



#### Changes in Population Size

- Dropped to an extreme low in the early 1900s
- International protection allowed a population increase; the Pribilof Islands population reached a peak, ~2.2 million, in the 1940s-early 1950s
- Then, an overall population decline partially due to commercial harvest of females in 1956-1968
- In 1988, labeled "depleted" under the Marine Mammal Protection Act
