JALLC personnel actively deploy to current operations and participate in numerous annual NATO deployable forces exercises in order to gather data in support of their analysis. To support analysis projects in Afghanistan, JALLC maintains a permanent representative at the HQ of the International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) to provide direct liaison with ISAF.



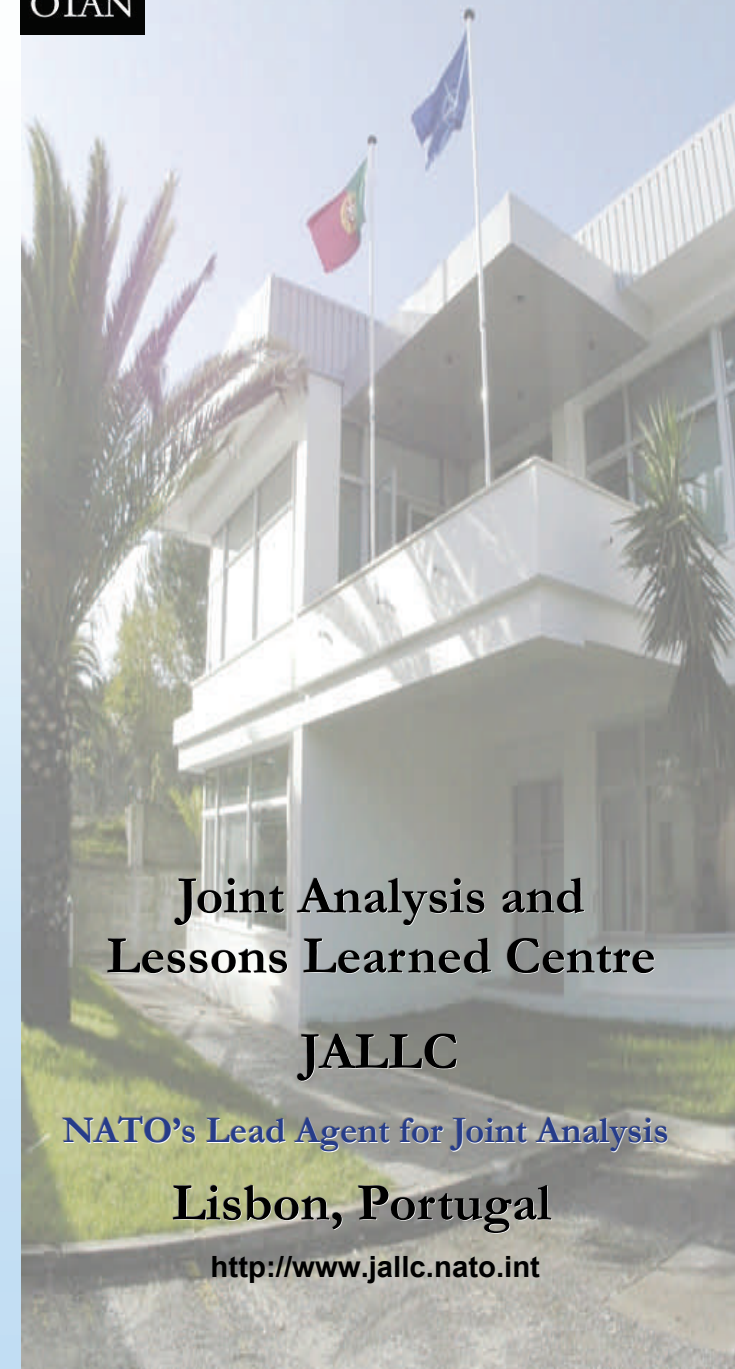
After performing data collection and documenting observations, a JALLC analysis team develops findings and identifies lessons through analysis. To achieve analysis objectives, JALLC analysts use many tools, including advanced statistical analysis and mathematical modelling. The analysts interpret and consolidate findings in order to derive recommendations. These recommendations, as lessons identified, are formalized in reports for review and endorsement. The JALLC's analysis reports provide the insight necessary to enable NATO to address issues and propagate best practice.

JALLC OVERVIEW

The Joint Analysis and Lessons Learned Centre (JALLC) is NATO's centre for performing joint analysis of current operations, training and exercises. Reporting directly to the Supreme Allied Commander Transformation (SACT), the JALLC recommends development or improvement of concepts, doctrine, and capabilities. The JALLC also maintains the NATO interactive and managed Lessons Learned Database (LLDb), and supports Allied Command Transformation (ACT) outreach activities in the Lessons Learned domain.

The JALLC publishes the Joint Analysis Handbook and the Lessons Learned Handbook, and hosts the annual NATO Lessons Learned Conference. The JALLC, in operation since 2002, is located in Monsanto, on the outskirts of Lisbon, Portugal, and has a permanent staff of 50 military and civilian personnel from 18 NATO countries.

ANALYSIS AND OUTREACH ACTIVITIES

JALLC reports are widely distributed across NATO: to NATO HQ, ACT, Allied Command Operations (ACO), to the Nations via the National Liaison Representatives and National Military Representatives, and often to Partner and Troop Contributing Nations. SACT tasks the JALLC directly with an annual Programme of Work (POW) to reflect the operational and transformational needs of NATO.



Up to 15 major tasks are analyzed and reported each year. Upon completion of the formal analysis for each project, the JALLC submits the findings and recommendations to SHAPE and HQ SACT directly, who endorse each recommendation and develop an implementation plan for putting the recommendations in action. NATO's Lesson Learned Database (LLDb) is updated and maintained to show the responsibilities for implementing an endorsed action and any associated milestones.

In 2010, the JALLC, on behalf of SACT, established the JALLC Advisory and Training Team (JATT), with the aim of providing support to NATO HQs and bodies, NATO Nations and Partner Nations in order to assist them in improving or establishing their lessons learned capabilities.

NATO LESSONS LEARNED DATABASE

The JALLC manages two accessible NATO LLDBs; a classified LLDB on the NS WAN (<https://lldb.jallc.nato.int/lldb>) since April 2005; and an unclassified LLDB on the internet (<https://lldb.jallc.nato.int/lldb>) since June 2006.

The classified LLDB currently stores over 1200 observations and lessons from NATO operations, exercises and training worldwide. The database interface allows users to subscribe to e-mail alerts informing them when staffing changes take place and as milestone dates approach. Observations are linked with staffing criteria from the NATO Task List (NTL) to allow for trend analysis and insight into recurring themes being observed, both in operations and exercises. This functionality provides users with a tool to perform joint analysis and the archive ability to review past best practices.

How to get JALLC Support

To get an analysis requirement into JALLC's annual POW, NATO organizations need to submit them through their chain of command to SHAPE and HQ SACT. Urgent requirements can be submitted at any time for consideration.
