Scope of Work Marine Protected Areas Federal Advisory Committee (MPA FAC) Cultural Heritage Resources Working Group March 15, 2011

The National Marine Protected Areas Center (MPA Center) has formed a Cultural Heritage Resources Working Group under the MPA FAC to provide technical expertise and recommendations to the full Committee on submerged cultural heritage resources for the development of a National System of Marine Protected Areas (MPAs). The MPA FAC develops recommendations for the Departments of Commerce and the Interior on the implementation of Executive Order 13158, marine protected areas.

Operations: Under the terms of the MPA FAC Charter, the Committee "may establish scientific or other working groups consisting of MPA FAC members and/or outside experts," to be "selected by the MPA FAC in consultation with the Under Secretary of Commerce for Oceans and Atmosphere and the Department of the Interior." In September 2009, the Committee voted to establish a Cultural Heritage Resources Working Group to address this forthcoming charge.

The working group is co-chaired by a member from the MPA Center and the MPA FAC, and will develop draft recommendations for consideration and action by the full Committee. The working group includes both FAC members and external experts on cultural heritage resources from federal, state and tribal agencies, as well as academia and/or non-governmental organizations.

The working group will meet 1-2 times a year (based on availability of funds), and will otherwise conduct its business via email and conference calls. The working group has created two smaller task groups to address specific issues before obtaining input from the entire working group. These subgroups represent tribal/indigenous interests and historic/archaeological interests.

Purpose: To provide guidance for advancing the cultural heritage track of National MPA System development.

The conservation of the nation's cultural heritage is one of the three goals of the national system of MPAs. The Framework defines cultural heritage as "the cultural resources that reflect the nation's maritime history and traditional cultural connections to the sea, and the uses and values they provide to present and future generations." The national system of MPAs will strengthen the protection of cultural heritage resources by 1) enhancing coordination among MPAs, and 2) conducting regional gap analyses to identify areas that contribute to the system's priority conservation objectives which would benefit from additional protection.

The primary conservation objectives of the national system's Cultural Heritage Goal are to "conserve and manage":

- Key cultural and historic resources listed in the National Register of Historic Places;
- Key cultural and historic resources determined eligible for the NRHP or listed on a State register;
- Key cultural sites that are paramount to a culture's identify and/or survival;
- Key cultural and historic sites that may be threatened;

- Key cultural and historic sites that can be utilized for heritage tourism; and
- Key cultural and historic sites that are underrepresented."

Charge:

The Cultural Heritage Resources Working Group will assist in developing and fulfilling the goals of the national system of MPAs by:

- Ensuring that the best scientific and management information available, as well as traditional knowledge systems and multiple voices, are incorporated into these processes;
- Ensuring that all work and analysis is coordinated with the participating agencies;
- Making recommendations to the full FAC based on the group's expertise and experience.

Key Questions:

- What is the MPA FAC's vision of the cultural heritage track of the national MPA system? What should it emphasize and include?
- How can NOAA and DOI best support the participation of cultural heritage MPAs within the national MPA system?
- What factors should NOAA and DOI consider in developing the gap analysis for cultural heritage resources? What type of conceptual framework should be developed to guide the cultural heritage gap analysis?
