| Course | AP Spanish |
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| Location | Zama American High School |
| Course Description | This is a third year college level class and requires a certain commitment on the part of the student. The class will be conducted in Spanish. In order to perform well on the AP test students will be expected to speak Spanish in class and spend at least 1.5 hours preparing outside of class. Students are expected to compete most of the grammar review and practice outside of class. I suggest finding a study group or a study buddy for support and practice. <br> AP Spanish is a rigorous course with challenging material. My goal for my students is not simply to pass the AP test but to become effective and confident speakers of Spanish. Please let me know if you need additional support. I am available for tutoring after school. The course culminates with the taking of the Spanish AP exam which is scheduled for the week of May 5-10th. <br> The course is thematically based that includes authentic reading and listening tasks and presentational and interpersonal writing and speaking activities that focus on a unifying theme. <br> By the end of the course, students should be able to: <br> -Communicate effectively in Spanish in the interpersonal, presentational, and interpretive modes; <br> -Communicate in Spanish with a strong command of linguistic skills, including accuracy and fluency; comprehend Spanish intended for native speakers in a variety of settings, types of discourse, topics, styles, registers, and regional variations; <br> -Produce Spanish comprehensible to native speakers in a variety of settings, types of discourse, topics and registers; acquire information from authentic sources in Spanish and; <br> -Demonstrate an awareness of some cultural perspectives of Spanish-speaking people. <br> The main goal of the course is to increase the students' communicative competence in Spanish. Students will communicate effectively using the four skills of speaking, listening, reading and writing. <br> Writing Skills |
